### Woodlot Owners Asked To Eugene Tax Meeting

Woodland owners, undecided about their choice of taxation laws, will find enlightenment at the meeting of the Small Woodlands Association Saturday, Dec. 9, Harris Hall, county courthouse in Eugene, beginning at 1:30 p.m.  
W. G. Nash, Creswell, associa-

tion president, explains that the new forestry tax law passed during the last session of the legislature and the optional tax for owners with holdings of 1,000 acres or less have left many woodland owners "more than a little confused."  
Two state representatives, slated to clarify the new forest tax set up, are Paul Liniger, state Tax Commission, who will explain the new tax law going into effect Jan. 1, and E. R. Manock, staff forester with Oregon State Forestry Department, who will discuss the optional tax for owners of 1,000 acres or less.  
Tom Cochran, representative of the Industrial Forestry Association, will discuss the Tree Farm movement in Oregon.

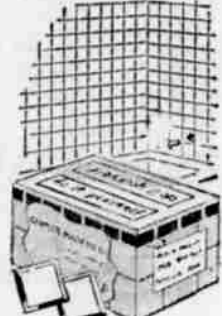

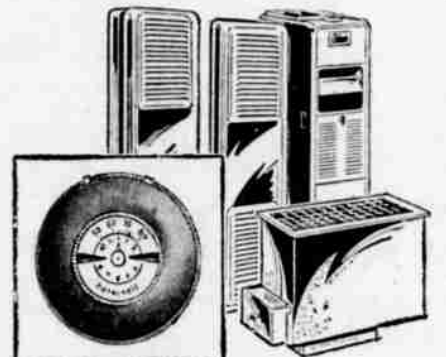
