## Boycott Threatens Macon City Buses

MACON, Ga. (AP)—White persons in unusually large numbers have begun riding Macon city buses in a move to counter a Negro boycott that threatens the transit system.

New incidents of minor violence cropped up this week, and Negro leaders put new demands to the transit company in this middle Georgia city of about 120,000.

Several instances of rock-throwing at buses were reported. Two Negro youths were taken into custody.

Negroes earlier had complained to Mayor Ed Wilson of alleged police harassment in connection with Negroes driving in car pools. The boycott began Monday as Negroes demanded an end to segregated seating and the employment of Negroes as drivers and mechanics.

The Rev. E. B. Paschal, chairman of the Macon Citizens Negotiating Committee, said Wednesday night the Negro group would demand also that charges be dropped against four ministers and 12 students arrested in attempts to desegregate Macon buses.

## Gov. Volpe Refuses To Return Escapee

BOSTON (AP)—Massachusetts Gov. John A. Volpe has given refuge to a Mississippi prisoner who said he fled north rather than participate in a scheme involving the recovery of a \$300,000 robbery loot.

Volpe refused to return Kimble Berry, 24, to Mississippi as a fugitive.

The Southern state claimed Berry failed to return to the prison from a 10-day Christmas furlough, customarily given by that state to model prisoners.

Berry had 5½ months left to serve on a manslaughter conviction, arising from a brawl.

Berry, however, told Massachusetts officials a different story was relayed by Mississippi authorities.

He said he was released from Parchman Prison in Mississippi Dec. 5 to pick up the proceeds from a robbery which had been cached in a Keiser, Ark., bank.

Berry told police he had been given a power of attorney, a pistol, a driver's license and an auto with instructions on how to get the money back to the prison.

But outside the bank, Berry said, he saw two men, one apparently carrying a gun in a pocket. He became frightened for his life and fled to the home of a brother in Lynn, Mass. He later went to the police and told his story.

# Opera Troupe Asks Asylum

HONG KONG (AP)—A 52-member opera troupe from Communist China is seeking asylum in this British colony.

The troupe, including eight teenage girls, reached Hong Kong Monday in a motorized junk from Kwangtung Province.

Troupe leader Tsang Kwang-sung told newsmen they overpowered Chinese Communist officials on board the junk Sunday when they were sent from one fishing village to another, entertaining villagers and Communist border militia.

Most of the fugitives drew a stark picture of living conditions in Communist China. The daily rice ration, they said, had been reduced to the starvation point. Eleven Communist officials and crew members whom the fugitives overpowered are also in Hong Kong. A government spokesman declined to comment on the case.

# NPS Won't Cover Vanderbilt Ladies

WASHINGTON (AP) — The director of the National Parks Service has no intention of covering up those gaily coveting seminudes on the ceiling of the ornate Vanderbilt mansion at Hyde Park, N.Y.

"It is true there is a semi-nude woman there, but she is lovely," Conrad L. Wirth said recently. "It is a nice thing."

The lightly clad ladies are in a 29 x 30-foot painting which workmen have uncovered on the ceiling of the mansion's plush gold room. The mansion, operated by the Interior Department as a national historic site since 1940, was built in 1888 by railroad tycoon Frederick W. Vanderbilt.

Wirth said Mrs. Vanderbilt apparently had the ceiling painted

over shortly before she died in 1926. After workmen cleaned away the water paint covering, the question arose whether the painting would be open to the public.
