

Results Of Whistler's Bend Project Noted

COUNT AND MARK, count and mark, some 6,400 times. Of the 73,000 summer steelhead planted in the rearing pond last year, only 6,400 survived. The fish were individually counted and their fins clipped Saturday when the pond was drained off. The fish were clipped so they could be identified when they returned to the Umpqua River as adults. Following the counting, they were released into the river. The small count was blamed on lack of oxygen in the water and high water temperatures last summer. Food was said to have been more than plentiful.

State's Bowlers Eligible For Tourney Of Champions

Bowlers from all Oregon associations are eligible to compete in this year's annual Tournament of Champions which is set to open at Milwaukee Bowl May 12.

The tourney was inaugurated two years ago for bowlers of the Portland association. Because of the increasing number of requests the tourney has been opened to all

Oregon keglers.

The Tournament of Champions is unique in the fact that only first and second place league winners may enter. Handicap is based on a team maximum to enter to the average bowler, not the scratch shooter.

In 1960 the winning team had a 776 average, while the 1961 title was captured by Frank's Floor Covering from Mayfair Lanes with an 861 average.

A handicap five-game singles for men will also be offered to those bowling in the team competition. The women's team event will be set up the same as the men's, with only first and second place winners in league play eligible to compete.

The tourney will be held on three weekends. Entries close May 11 for the team event and May 27 for the singles action.

All bowling establishments in the state will have entry blanks for the Tournament of Champions. Bud and Champ Husted of Milwaukee Bowl will be the hosts for the tournament.
