

Polling Places Listed For City Levy Election

Polling places and election boards for the Roseburg municipal levy election were listed today by the city clerk's office.

There are no changes in polling centers from the previous city levy election with the exception that Fourth Ward voters will ballot at the new City Hall council chambers instead of at the Elks Lodge.

Polls will be open from 2 p.m. to 8 p.m. Pacific Standard Time.

Question before voters is:

"Shall a special tax levy in the sum of \$288,621.07 over and above the 6 per cent constitutional limitation be made by the city . . . for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1962, made necessary by increased operating and other governmental expenses which have been caused by growth and added population of the city and by reason of a small and inadequate tax base?"

Registered voters who reside inside the corporate city limits are qualified to vote provided they have registered 30 days prior to the election. In other words, if a person has not registered by this time, it's too late for this year's levy vote.

Polling places and election boards were listed as follows:

Ward I — Benson School (for Umpqua, Benson, West Mill and Eastwood precincts); election chairman, Alvera Peterson.

Ward II — Two polling places. 1. Roseburg High School Library, (for Wharton, Laurelwood and West Roseburg precincts); chairman, Harry Booth; 2. Hucrest School (for Hucrest precinct); chairman, Dorothy Brinkley.

Ward III — West Side Fire Station (for Grove, Orchard, North Brown, Brown, Brown West and Fairhaven precincts); chairman, Sadie Currier.

Ward IV — City Hall Council Chambers (for Lane, Deer Creek, Hamilton, Woodward, Caro, Herman, Roseburg, Miller and Hawthorne precincts); chairman, Maude Kidder.

Red Cross Slates Water Safety Class

Classes offering instructor certification in YMCA aquatic leadership and Red Cross water safety will be conducted at Eugene Central Lane YMCA April 27, 28 and 29, and May 5 and 6.

This will be a combined YMCA-Red Cross institute set up to qualify additional water safety instructors in the light of increased water recreation activity.

Minimum age for participating in the YMCA instructor and director certification course is 17. Minimum age for Red Cross water safety instruction is 18.

Tom Young, director, said the institute will give volunteers training in the instruction of lifesaving, water safety, stroke analysis, swimming skills and artificial respiration.

Fire Control School Scheduled For Forest Service Supervisors

School days are coming up for Forest Service personnel who serve supervisory fire control positions for the Umpqua National Forest.

Larry Thorpe, Umpqua fire control officer, said today the annual Fire Overhead Training School is scheduled April 24, 25 and 26 at Wolf Creek training camp, located 30 miles east of Roseburg on Little River Rd.

30 To Participate
About 30 Forest Service personnel will participate, along with others from the Bureau of Land Management and Douglas Forest Protective Association. Fire control experts from the Portland regional office of the Forest Service will provide instruction.

Thorpe said the first day will be devoted to consideration of fire weather and fire behavior. Don Smith, North Umpqua District assistant ranger, will be in charge. Smith is a graduate of a national fire behavior school conducted at Mirana Park near Tucson, Ariz.

Law enforcement, fire investigation and trespass are topics scheduled for the second day. Instructors will include Verden Hockett, Douglas County deputy district attorney; Don Wright, Roseburg, state fire inspector; and Bill Cummins, Portland, law enforcement and trespass specialist from Forest Service regional office.

General Subjects Planned

General subjects are planned for the third day, including fire overhead positions, fire dispatching, safety and fire prevention.

Thorpe said "overhead" personnel are men who would assume leadership positions on a project fire. Last year's school was devoted to crew boss training.

Men who complete the overhead school will be qualified to take over supervisory fire control positions not only on the Umpqua but on forests located elsewhere in the region, he explained.

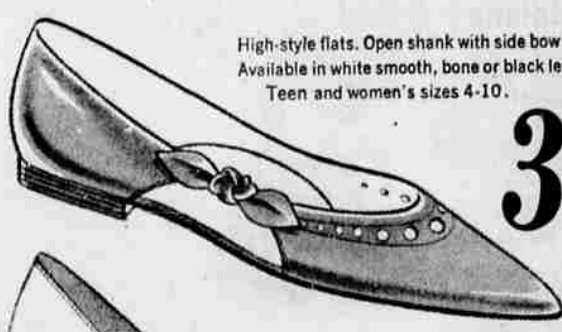

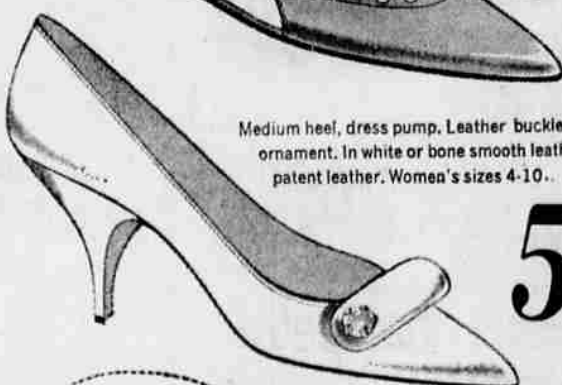

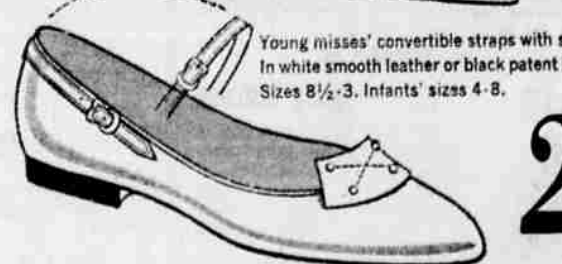
