

100-H.P. Outboards Set For '62

The first 100 horsepower outboard motor, electric shifts, tilt mechanisms, a host of new models, and some price reductions are among the highlights of outboard motor lines offered by manufacturers for 1962.

A selective shift is found this year on some motors. This is an electric control that offers simplified push button gear shifting. A new clutch mechanism permits shifting at a higher engine speed. Electramatic Drive is available on tow models this year. This is an automatic clutch which operates by a single-lever remote control. The throttle and shift are on a single lever controlled by electro-magnets.

Remote control electric tilt is available on some models and a controlled power tilt is available for the larger motors. The device operates through a hydraulic pump which is fastened to the right side of the stern bracket of the motor.

Two new 28 horsepower models are making an appearance this year. All have taken on the new compact look through the re-design of the motor cover.

The boys' quartette and the girls' pantomime will appear again at 7 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

Smith promises to have something for everyone attending the boat show. The talent show is being sponsored by the Umpqua Boat Club.

CHANGE CRANKCASE OIL

Owners of inboard boats should change the crankcase oil in the engine every 100 operating hours. Some experts suggest that crankcase should be drained and replenished at least once every season regardless of the amount of use given the powerplant, to eliminate water and impurities which can collect even if the boat is not in operation.

Jet Power, Stern Drive Applied To Smaller Craft

Use of inboard-outboard stern units and jet drives for power in various small inboard cruisers and runabouts is one of the outstanding trends in recreational boating circles this year.

Two companies have water jet runabouts.

Prices of the I-O small cruisers under 25 feet are holding a range of from \$4,000 to \$5,000, generally without such items as bunk mattresses and galley equipment. Runabouts with I-O power are generally in the \$3,000 to \$4,000 range, with smart styling bucket or convertible lounge-type seats, recessed dash boards and complete hardware.

KEEP PLUGS CLEAN

Moisture or dirt film on spark plugs will lead to starting failures or erratic operation in marine engines. Keep the ceramic insulators wiped clean, electrodes, maintained at the proper gap and firing end of the plugs free of oil or carbon deposits.

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
