

Germond Hurls Two-Hitter, Holds Bulldogs Scoreless

Wayne Germond tossed a brilliant two-hitter Thursday as the Oakland Oakers shut out the invading Sutherlin Bulldogs, 5-0, in a non-league diamond duel.

Germond limited the Bulldogs to two singles in working the full five innings for the win. Germond's teammates backed him with a single run in the third, then broke loose for four insurance runs in the fourth.

Blaze of Glory
Sutherlin went out in a blaze of glory, leaving the bases loaded. The big threat came with one out when the Bulldogs managed to fill the bases. However a fly to left field and a grounder to the second baseman ended the threat before any damage could be done.

Oakland's first run came in the third inning when Lloyd Lewis walked, stole second and third and scored on a Sutherlin error.

In the fourth frame the Oakers started a rally with one out. Larry Sorenson reached first on an error, then moved up on Steve Perry's single. Dave Roadman collected a base rap to load the bases and set the scene for Derold Holcomb's base blow that drove in two runs. The Oakers kept going as Lewis beat out a bunt which scored Roadman and Cannon followed with a bunt single scoring Holcomb.

The Bulldogs ended Oakland's rally with a double play. Eugene Anderson lined sharply to shortstop, and Lewis was caught off second.

The Oakers will return to Bico-B play Tuesday against Elkton, while the Bulldogs host the Riddle Irish in an Umpqua Valley League twin bill April 21.

OSU Cindermen Ready For Cal, Fresno State

OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY trackmen will be entered in their normal events Saturday at Berkeley when the Beavers take on California and Fresno State, Coach Sam Bell said today.

One exception is John Ball, normally entered in either the 440 or relay event. Ball is slated to run the 880 for the first time at Berkeley, and possibly will enter the 100.

California has several top-flight individual performers, but does not figure to have as much depth and overall balance as the Beavers. The same situation exists at Fresno State.

OSU Boost
The possible return to action of Ron Palmer could be a boost to OSU — especially in the future against such powerhouses as Oregon. Palmer is a 24-foot broad jumper, and would add good depth behind fast-improving Jim Roehm. Gary Rossi, too, has not yet found the range in that event, but could be effective when he does.

Lynn Eves, who stepped out of his regular sprint events last week to win the 440 in the amazing time of :46.7, will be back to the 100

and 220 this week. In the 440 are Bob Johnson, Norm Monroe and either Gary Comer or John Ball. Distance star Dale Story, holder of the fastest outdoor three-mile time this season nationally, will enter the two-mile only at Berkeley. His best there was 9:09.2 last year, but he wasn't pressed. Last week he clipped off an 8:46.9.

Into Form
If Steve Pauly rounds into form, OSU should sweep the javelin behind Gary Stenlund and Dan Likens. The Beavers' crack mile relay quartet of Eves, Comer, Johnson and Monroe will be out to better their 1962 mark of 3:10.6.

Tied With Medford
Going into the action Salem is tied with Medford's Cyclones for first place. Salem and Medford have identical 5-2 records. Eugene's Emeralds rest in third with a 4-3 mark, while Roseburg brings up the rear with a 1-6 season record.

Salem goes into Sunday's match leading the league in three important statistical categories. The Valley Victors have rolled a total pinfall so far this year of 13,400 and the team is packing a 596 average per man. Salem's 73 points

in league play gives it first in that department.
