

Men's State Bowling Tourney Ends

The 1962 Oregon Men's Association state bowling tournament is now a matter of record.
Tourney action wound up at Roseburg Bowl Sunday night.
During the last weekend, three new leaders moved to the fore to win championships. Bob Victorin, Klamath Falls, came with a record of 1,857 pins. Shockey's record - breaking 718 Class A singles series. Sparked by his 711 series Victorin took over in

the Class A all-events with 1,857 pins. Victorin's all-events total is just eight pins off the record, and ranks as the second highest all-events score recorded since the beginning of the tourney in 1939.
Class B Doubles
Elmer Seabright of Roseburg and Sam Fullman of Portland teamed up to take the crown in the Class B doubles. The pair won top money with a score of 1,226.
The other new leader as a result of the final weekend of bowling is Bill Drechsler of Silverton. Drechsler won the Class C all-events crown with a 1,718 total.
During the six weekends of the state tournament, Shockey's 718 Class A singles series was the only new record set. Shockey bettered the old mark of 718 set by Martin Severson of Astoria in 1948.
In addition to Seabright, the only other local winner was Cardinal Tire in the Class D team action. Cardinal Tire edged Frank and Bob's Flying A team of Roseburg by one pin for first place.
Masters Tournament

In the Masters Tournament qualifying round Duane Nelson moved into second place among the qualifiers with a score of 1,116. Frank Evans of Salem proved to be one of the most consistent bowlers in the Masters. He strung lines of 201, 209, 204, 203 and 205 together for a 1,022 total and eighth place among the qualifiers.
The masters Tournament will be rolled off April 27-28-29 at Roseburg Bowl. The low qualifying score for the tourney was an 833.
