Expo-Lodging Service Gets Back In Business
SEATTLE (AP)—Expo-Lodging Service, which finds housing for World's Fair visitors, was back in business this week after a drastic slow-down forced by a city ordinance intended to block evictions of long-time tenants from hotels and apartment houses. Many apartment houses had evicted regular tenants and converted to hotel-type operation. "This is strictly a matter between the city and each individual hotel, apartment, motel owner or operator," said Willis Camp, an assistant vice president of the Fair. "It is not for Expo-lodging to concern itself with problems between each owner-operator and the City of Seattle." Earlier Camp had said the ordinance would force about 85 percent of the hotels to cut back the number of rooms available for visitors and necessitate the relocation of thousands of Fair arrivals whose reservations would be cancelled. A committee has been set up by the city to license housing facilities under the new ordinance.

FINANCIAL AID FOR JFK
BOSTON (AP) — Newell Garden, an electronics company employee, says he knew President John F. Kennedy when he didn't have a dime. Garden relates how he met Kennedy at LaGuardia Airport, New York, when Kennedy was in the Senate. "How are you, Senator?" Garden asked, necessitating the relocation of thousands of Fair arrivals whose reservations would be cancelled. Kennedy reversed the charge to Hyannisport.
