Young 'Governor' Insists Humility Is Top Quality

SALEM, Ore. (AP) — "A governor should be humble, I think; not too demanding or arrogant," Gov. James I. Swenson of the 1962 YMCA mock legislature said today.

"He should also be open-minded, which is a characteristic of all legislators," the elected, teenage governor said.

'Legislature' Addressed

The young governor — nearly six feet tall with dark hair — addressed a joint session of the mock legislature, suggesting consideration of the points:

"First, in the area of health and welfare. Perhaps measures could be taken to regulate more closely the granting of state welfare funds to various applicants."

Some types of examinations or strict investigations should enable a more efficient program, he said.

"Second, the development of a more efficient civil defense program might also be considered,
