

Rep. Green's Endorsement Of Pearson Starts Fireworks In Oregon Primaries

Rep. Edith Green endorsed Walter Pearson for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination Saturday night, gave a favoring nod to two candidates for Multnomah county commissioner, and touched off a bit of fireworks in the Oregon primary election campaign.

Four Vehicles Crash At Drain

Four vehicles carrying a total of 11 persons were involved in an accident on Oregon Route 38 just west of Drain at about 9:50 a.m. Saturday. Two persons suffered minor bruises.

Vehicle No. 3, then sideswiped vehicle No. 4, operated by Floyd Herbert Willson, Eugene, which was proceeding west in the north lane of traffic and vehicle No. 3 then sideswiped the left front fender of vehicle No. 1.

Vehicle No. 3 came to rest in the south ditch. No. 4 came to rest in the north ditch. Nos. 1 and 2 stopped in the south lane of traffic. No. 1 received a dented left front fender, No. 2, a smashed left rear fender, and No. 3 received a dented right front fender and smashed left front fender.

Mary Wilson and Arlene Guthrie, both of Eugene, suffered bruises but were not seriously injured. They were passengers in the No. 4 car, along with Ronald Edward Guthrie and Vickie Rene Guthrie, small children, both of Eugene.

WHITE SALMON, Wash. (AP)—Larry Cummings, 25, North Bonneville, Wash., apparently drowned Sunday after his boat overturned on remote Bass Lake.

His son, Larry Jr., 3, was found by fishermen 2 1/2 hours before Cummings' body was recovered. The boy, wearing a life preserver, was floating on the lake. His father apparently had no preserver.

When found the boy was unconscious and his condition was described as critical. But he was quickly revived and hospital attendants said Sunday his condition was improved so much that he could be released before long.

Cummings' brother, Ray, said he was an excellent swimmer and that a bruise on his forehead indicated he might have been knocked unconscious by something that hit him when his outboard motorboat capsized.

The widow, Dorothy, and a daughter, 8 months, also survive.

Just east of Lebanon, a three-car mixup Sunday took the life of William Andrew Humphrey, 33, Lebanon. His car smashed into the rear of another which in turn was hurled into the path of a third.

Two persons suffered non-fatal injuries.

Near Springfield, Ark., two cars collided at an intersection Saturday, killing Martin Branscum, 64, Winston, Ore., and injuring six others.

At Vancouver, Wash., Mrs. Elmer Van Lindt, Ashland, Ore., died Sunday of injuries suffered in a Tuesday accident. Her husband died shortly after the accident.

Oregon's death toll on the highways this year now stands at 137 in the Associated Press tabulation.

Literacy Bill Vote Fails To Limit Debate In Senate

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Senate today beat down for a second time a motion to limit debate on the administration's voting literacy test bill.

The action probably will result in pigeonholing for this session of Congress a measure to establish a sixth-grade education as qualification to vote in federal elections.

Today's vote against limiting debate was 52-42. This was far short of the two-thirds affirmative vote required to shut off a polite Southern filibuster against the measure.

The Senate last week rejected a similar cloture motion by a vote of 53-43. But it voted 64-33 then against sheaving the bill in a maneuver calculated to permit members to express their support for a measure they knew wasn't going to be passed.

Just before the vote today, Sen. Francis Case, R-S.D., served notice he will seek to call up as a substitute for the literacy test bill a proposed constitutional amendment to accomplish the same purpose.

California Pair Held On Drain Larceny Count

The suspects were arrested by Grants Pass state police on Drain Justice Court warrants, which set bail at \$5,000 each. The two matched the description given by Drain City Police of persons seen in the store just before the money was discovered to be missing, according to officers.

They are scheduled for arraignment in Drain Justice Court today.
