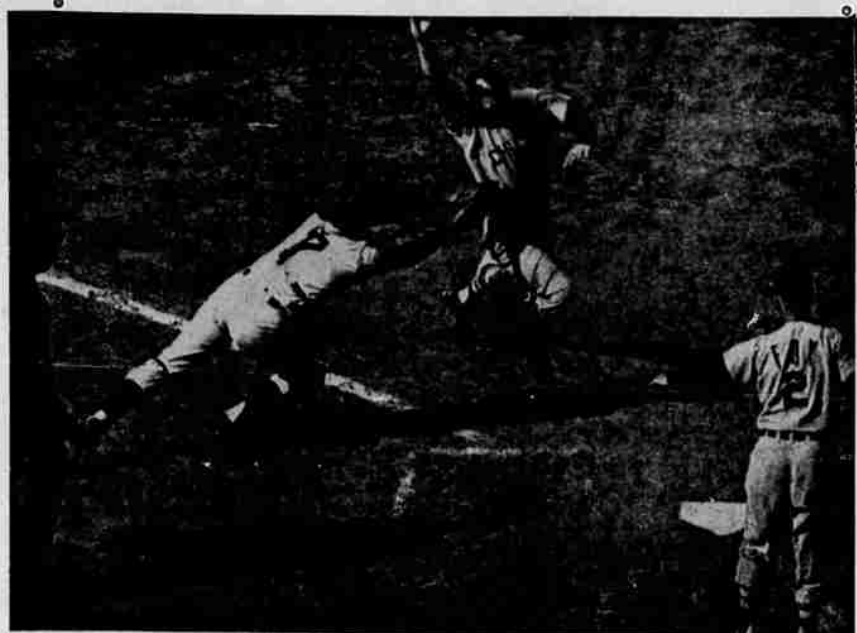

Pinson Snatches NL Homer Lead While Mays Heads Into Slump

"Anything Willie Mays can do, Vada Pinson can do as well." That's Cincinnati Manager Fred Hutchinson on the subject of two dazzling National League center fielders, his own Pinson and wondrous Willie of the San Francisco Giants.

Vada had another productive afternoon Sunday with his 11th homer and a triple as the Reds won their fourth in a row, beating Pittsburgh's faltering Pirates (6-4). Cincinnati's unbeaten Bob Purkey became a six-game winner with able relief help.

Giants Topped Houston

Meanwhile, even with Mays continuing his slump with an 0-for-5 performance, the Giants had little trouble romping over Houston 7-2 and holding onto their four-game lead.

Elsewhere in the NL, Los Angeles leap-frogged over St. Louis into second place, edging the Cardinals 4-3; Chicago eased out of the cellar in a doubleheader sweep over Philadelphia, 8-7 and 8-5 with reliever Barney Schultz winning both games; and Milwaukee dumped New York into last, trimming the Mets 2-2.

Took Leadership

Pinson took over the major league leadership in home runs when he socked No. 11 against loser Bob Friend (4-3) in the first inning. Then, after a three-run homer by Jim Marshall helped push the Pirates in front 4-1 in the third, Vada tripled in one run in the bottom of the inning and rode in on Frank Robinson's homer.

Cincinnati regained the lead in the sixth when Leo Cardenas singled in Gordie Coleman and added another run in the eighth on two

errors by Dick Groat, a sacrifice and a pinch single by Joe Gaines. **Prime Support**

Orlando Cepeda, Jim Davenport and Jose Pagan gave right-hander Jack Sanford his prime support in the Giants' runaway over Houston. Cepeda and Davenport rapped three hits each, while Pagan homered in the decisive fourth-run sixth inning and also had a single. Sanford (4-2) went the distance, allowing six hits, and was one out away from shutting out the Colts when Roman Mejias' double and Norm Larker's single chased in the Houston runs.

The loss went to winless Ken Johnson, now 0-5.

Behind the two-hit pitching of Don Hayter the Myrtle Creek Vikings recorded a 1-0 victory over the invading Bandon Bulldogs after losing the opener, 9-5, Saturday in a non-league twin-bill.

Hayter had a no-hitter going until the top of the fifth when two pinch hitters came on with two out and rapped singles. The Myrtle Creek junior struck out two and walked two while getting most of the Bandon hitters to pop-up.

The Vikings scored the winning run in the bottom of the third inning when freshman Eddie Mess collected a pinch-hit double and Tony Quinn followed with another two-bagger.

Bert Mason's single in the second inning was the only other Myrtle Creek hit in the second game. In the opener Viking starter Dean Halverson ran into trouble in the first inning when the Bulldogs struck fast for four runs. Mason came on to put out the fire.

Myrtle Creek tied the game with four runs in the bottom of the third on singles by Mason, Dennis Whaley, Rick Abrahamson, a fielder's choice, a walk to Mike Shurtliff and a pair of passed balls. A single run by the Vikings in the fourth put them in the lead.

Bandon came back with three runs in the top of the fifth on a two-run homer by Giles, and a solo circuit clout by Conrad. The Bulldogs added two insurance runs in the seventh.

Conrad had a perfect 4-4 game at the plate to lead the Bulldogs to the win, while Abrahamson was 2-4 for the Vikings.

Beamer's Bat Booms Big As Tribe Takes Victory

Jim Beamer's fourth-inning home run provided the Roseburg Indians with the margin in a narrow 4-3 victory over the host Willamette Wolverines Saturday in a Midwestern League outing.

Beamer's mighty clout over the right field fence gave the Indians a 4-0 lead and brought an end to their scoring for the game. Willamette rallied in the closing innings to cut Roseburg's lead to one, but could not push the tying run across.

Lefty Jon Burnham was credited with the win for the Indians. Burnham worked 3½ innings before being relieved by Dick Williams. The Wolverines collected their three hits off Burnham, with second baseman Carl Nicholson getting two of the base blows.

Burnham managed to hold the Wolverines scoreless for the first four innings. In the fifth Nicholson scored after reaching base on a single. Control trouble hit Burnham in the sixth when a walk brought Williams on with a two ball count on the batter. Willamette managed to get two runs in the sixth before Williams put out the fire.

Roseburg struck hard and fast in the first-inning with three runs. A double by Beamer was the big blow of the inning, and he came on around to score.

Willamette's sixth-inning rally came on two walks, one Roseburg error, a single and a fielder's choice.

Nicholson was the leading hitter for Willamette with two singles in two appearances at the plate. Bob McClain's single was the only other base rap for Willamette.

Roseburg now has a 3-5 Midwestern League record. As a result of the win the Tribe jumped into fourth place in the current standings. Willamette is now 2-5 in league play and is tied for fifth.

South Eugene's Axemen clinched the league title for the second year in a row by dumping the North Bend Bulldogs, 15-0. The Axemen exploded for eight runs in the first inning. South Eugene has a perfect 5-0 record, while second place North Eugene is three games back with only two games left to play.
