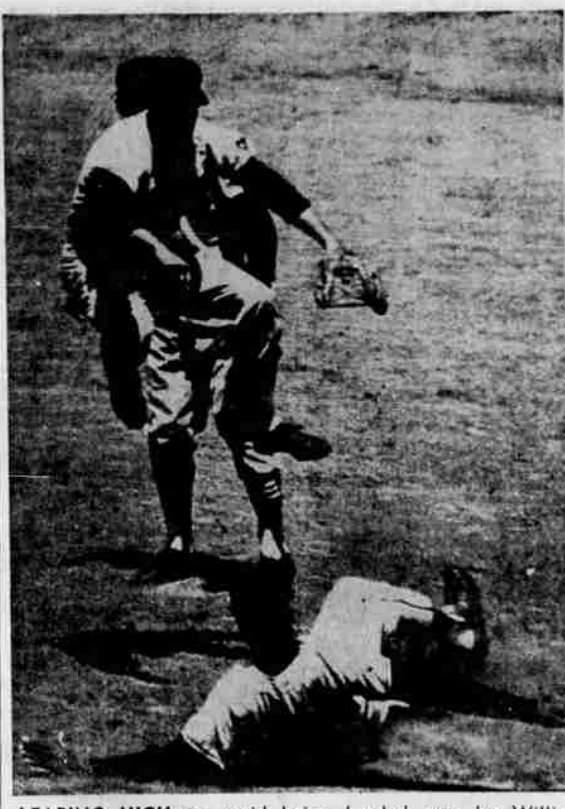

# Mets Now Show Sterner Stuff; Giants Earn Split With Colts

They haven't started printing the tickets yet, but some of the more frivolous types are starting to talk about a subway series.

Of course, there's always the chance the New York Yankees won't make it, but how about these Mets? The darlings of New York—an odd-lot collection of ex-peasants—suddenly are the hottest team in baseball.

## Giddy Heights

Casey Stengel's amaz'g Mets—who must be gasping for air in the giddy, rarified heights of eighth place in the National League—swept a double header from Milwaukee's stricken Braves, 7-6 and 9-6 Sunday making their record seven victories in nine starts.

San Francisco's leading Giants split a pair, losing to Houston 6-5 in the first and taking the second 7-4; St. Louis replaced Los Angeles in second place with a 4-3 edge over the Dodgers; Pittsburgh trounced Cincinnati 8-2 behind Vern Law, and Chicago's Ken Hubbs stoked eight hits in the Cubs' two victories over Philadelphia, 6-4 and 11-2.

In the American League, the Yankees split with Minnesota, New York winning the first 4-3 and

losing 4-2 in 13 innings; Cleveland and Detroit also split, the Indians taking the first 7-6, the Tigers the second 8-6; Kansas City beat Washington 1-0 in the opener, but the Senators took the second 7-5; Chicago beat Baltimore twice by identical 8-3 scores, and Los Angeles swept a pair from Boston, 5-3 and 1-0.

## Biggest Surprise

But the biggest surprise has to be Stengel's Mets. There is still an air of the Keystone Cops about this crew that lost nine straight at the start of the season—they flounder about and sometimes run into each other. But somehow Stengel, the old master manipulator, has them winning. They've won nine of their last 12 and are 12-10 since the opening string of losses—which would be good enough for a first-division berth.

They came from behind in each of Sunday's games, making it five victories in a row in which they overcame a deficit. A four-run eighth-inning burst brought them the first one and a six-run seventh-inning affair secured the nightcap.

The Mets trailed 5-1 in the first game and 3-1 in the second. Roy McMillan's two-run error in the eighth let in the deciding runs in the opener. Home runs by Frank Thomas, Charlie Neal and Felix Mantilla featured the winning rally in the nightcap.

## Cliff-Hangers

Each was a cliff-hanger, however. The Braves closed to within one in the last inning of the opener and had two in, three on and the winning run at the plate when Roger Craig stopped them in the final inning of the second.

Thomas, in addition to his 11th homer, had three other hits in the day's work and drove in five runs. Lefties Ken MacKenzie (2-1) and Al Jackson (2-4) were the winners.

The five-hit pitching of Bob Bruce (2-1) and a four-run third inning were the keys to Houston's first-game triumph over Juan Martinez (7-3) and San Francisco Giant lefty Billy Pierce (7-0) got the benefit of a six-run first inning and had little trouble in winning the nightcap, though touched for a two-run homer by Bob Aspromonte.

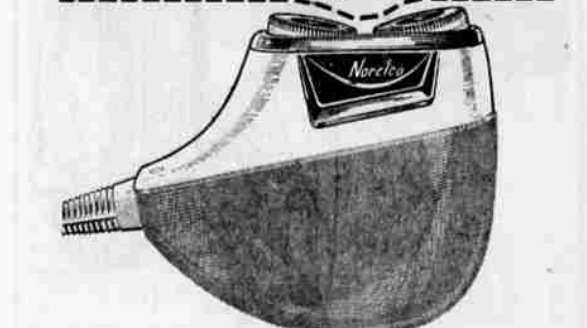
