## Lodge Will Seek Seat in Senate

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP)—John Davis Lodge, whose political background includes a governorship, an ambassadorship, and two terms in Congress, has decided to take a shot at the Senate.  
 Lodge, 58, had Republicans stewing for months trying to determine if he would make a bid for the Republican gubernatorial nomination but he moved quickly to enter the competition for the Senate nomination when it suddenly became available.  
 Lodge announced his candidacy recently in Westport, his home town.  
 Another candidate for the senatorial nomination is Rep. Horace Seely-Brown Jr. of the 2nd District.  
 Also in the running is a former congressman-at-large, Antoni N. Sadlak of Rockville.  
 Until Wednesday, the GOP choice for senator was incumbent Prescott Bush of Greenwich. But Bush suddenly announced he would not seek re-election to a third term.  
 Lodge, Connecticut's governor from 1950 to 1954, returned last year from a six-year stint as ambassador to Spain. Before serving as governor, he was in Congress two terms. He is the brother of former United Nations Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge.

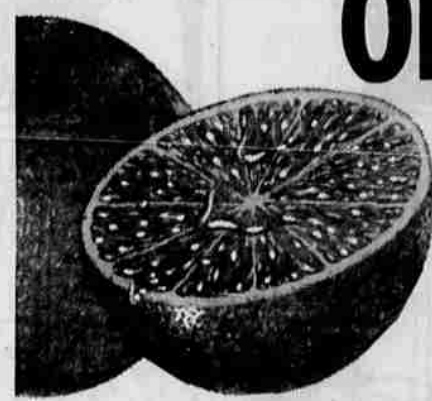
