

## Five Influenza Cases Reported In Douglas

Five cases of influenza were reported in Douglas County during the week ending June 2, the Oregon State Board of Health reports.

In its weekly communicable disease summary, the board noted the five cases as well as nine cases of pneumonia, eight of measles and one of tuberculosis.

During the previous week only one case of pneumonia and two cases of infectious hepatitis were noted.

## Rocks May Yield Water On Moon

SEATTLE (AP) — A famed nuclear scientist, Dr. Edward Teller, says man may be able to create water from rock on the moon with small atomic explosions.

"A few months ago in an experiment in New Mexico, a small nuclear device was exploded in a salt mine," he told graduates at Seattle University commencement exercises Friday night. From the mine came 200 tons of water vapor. This, on the moon, would have been worth its weight in gold."

Teller, who received an honorary doctor of laws degree from the school, said the moon also would permit observers there to see so clearly that "the light we are observing will have been emitted when the universe was young. We will find out much about the origins of the world."

He spoke of the possibility of science eventually becoming able to change the weather and said: "Once we are able to change the weather, we have lost our last safe topic of conversation. We will have Republican rain storms or Democratic droughts, and Siberian weather will become a trick of the capitalists."

## Universal Pictures Notes Its Fiftieth Anniversary

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Happy birthday, dear Universal Pictures, happy 50th birthday to you.

Carl Laemmle founded the company in New York City on June 8, 1912. That makes it older than any other movie empire, but younger than many leading men. Universal has always seemed young, despite its half-century of existence. From the start it was a scrappy little independent, fighting the big studios with nerve and talent. It has undergone many a change in operation, and soon will get its biggest change.

I can't report on the early days, but the film history books

record that Laemmle was a battler. He stood up to the trust that controlled the industry in the spawning days by strict enforcement of patents. A crusty little German immigrant, he shared what other movie pioneers had: An instinct for entertainment.

Laemmle may well have started the star system by hiring Florence Lawrence at \$1,000 a week and billing Mary Pickford with her own name, instead of "the girl with the curls."

He started building the sprawling Universal lot just over the hill from Hollywood in 1914. The studio boasts that it is the big-

gest single lot in town—"bigger than Princess Grace's Monaco." It is also the only studio with its own post office—Universal City. Laemmle's lot is likely to be in business for another 50 years.

Now Universal is on the verge of a merger with Revue. With such an infusion of energy, Laemmle's lot is likely to be in business for another 50 years.

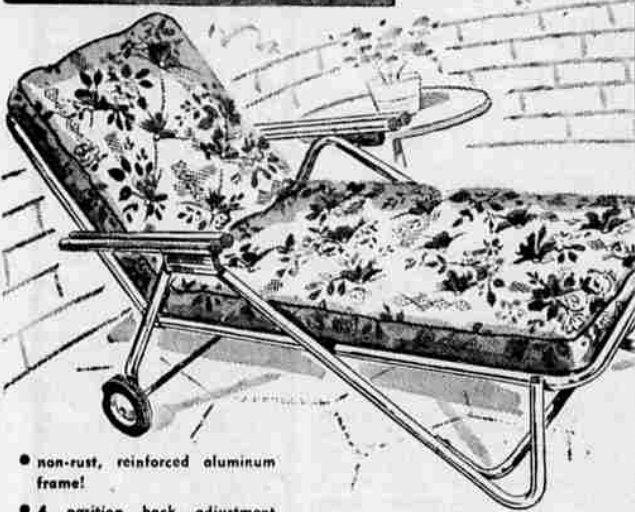
