Padres Clobber Bees To Narrow PCL Title Race

With one eye on the Pacific Coast League lead, San Diego's Padres blanked first-place Salt Lake City 7-0 Tuesday night and climbed within one game of the PCL lead.

It's the closest the Padres have been all season.

John Briggs, hurling a nifty six-hitter, racked up his second win over the Bees. He had plenty of help from his teammates, though, as they rattled three Salt Lake pitchers for eight hits.

In other games, third place Seattle stayed two games out despite their 6-3 loss to Portland. The Beavers employed slugging by Bill Kern and excellent relief pitching by Dan Osinski for the win. Kern drove in five runs.

Rounding out league games, the Tacoma Giants backed up John Goetz' steady mound performance with a 10-hit attack, downing Vancouver Mounties, 5-2.

And Spokane's Indians, playing before their smallest crowd in five years, 335 persons, hung a 7-1 defeat on Hawaii's Islanders.

The Indians used a combination of clutch hitting and Howie Reed's razor-sharp six-hit pitching for the win.

But the PCL spotlight was on San Diego. Harry Anderson bolstered Briggs' efficient mound performance with his sixth home run, blasting one over the center-field wall at the 400-foot mark in the fourth inning. The Padres' Tom Harper, Bob Klaus and Harry Anderson each had two hits apiece for the winners.

Stafford's Spree Ended By Tigers

NEW YORK (AP) — Bill Stafford's string of 25 scoreless innings has been broken by the New York Yankee right-hander couldn't care less.

"I didn't even know I had it," Stafford said in the clubhouse Tuesday night, still elated after a 2-1 victory over Frank Lary and the Detroit Tigers. The Tigers finally broke through with a run after two were out in the ninth.

The thing that Stafford was most pleased about was the fact that he didn't walk anybody. Yankee press box statisticians said he hadn't walked anybody in the last 33 innings.

"If I walk over 65 men in a season I think I have had a bad year," he said. "If you look it up, you'll find I walked exactly 100 in 406 innings, counting a few months in Richmond and three years with the Yankees."

Stafford, only 22, appears to be headed for his top year in the majors with a 6-3 record. In the last four starts he has allowed a total of only two hits and seven runs. Only two of the runs were earned.

Goldman Wins; Joins Sweeney As U. S. Entry

HOYLAKE, England (UPI) — David (Spec) Goldman and Bob Sweeney, a pair of aging but able golfers, were among 13 American survivors who moved out for second and third round matches today in the British Amateur championship.

Goldman, a 53-year-old businessman from Dallas, Tex., who was the runner-up in last week's French Amateur, faced England's R. E. Rimmer while Sweeney, a 50-year-old New Yorker who won this tournament in 1937, met Irishman John Glover in second round matches.

Mike Sanger of Bedford, N.Y., drew the toughest second round opponent among the Yankees. He was pitted against British Ryder Cupper Mike Lunt. Former Wimbledon tennis champion Bob Falkenburg, a California native who now resides in Brazil, played Dr. C. C. Bird of Scotland.

Other second round matches involving Americans pitted Richard Davies of Pasadena, Calif., against England's D. P. Davidson, John Nicholson of Glen Cove, N.Y., against England's Rodney Foster, Lynn Creason of Las Vegas, Nev., against Jean Louis du Pont of France, Poyd O'Donnell of Los Angeles against England's Norman Jones, and Lt. Monroe (Binky) Mitchell of Fort Worth, Tex., against England's Tony Slark.

Yanks already held berths in the third round and will see more action today. Martin Stanovich of Miles, Ill., meets Pat Brady of Reidsville, N.C., in an all-American match, while Bud Rudolph of Los Angeles faces England's Roger Robinson and William Castleman of White Sulphur Springs, W. Va., plays England's Pat Clark.

Sweeney was the only American who did not play Tuesday. Nine of his compatriots were eliminated along with defending champion Mike Bonnalack of England, who dropped a 2 and 1 decision to 22-year-old Jackson Taggart Jr., son of a noted Irish player.

OMAHA, Neb. (UPI)—Michigan and Florida State, the only teams to survive the first two rounds of the NCAA national baseball tournament without a loss, collide tonight to see which will advance to the semifinals as tourney favorites.

Michigan danced past Holy Cross, 11-4, and Florida State scored a run in the ninth without a hit to pull a 5-4 decision out of the fire against Ithaca Tuesday night.

There were to be two more casualties in the double-elimination tourney today. Santa Clara and Holy Cross battled for survival this afternoon and Texas meets Ithaca to open tonight's doubleheader.

The Texans smashed Colorado State, 11-2, and Santa Clara outlasted Missouri, 7-4, in a dozen innings to trim two other squads from the original eight-team field Tuesday.

Missouri didn't give up easily. After Santa Clara united a 1-1 knot with a pair of runs in the eighth and added another in the top of the ninth, it looked blue for the Tigers. But they cracked five singles, scored three runs and forced an overtime. But the Missouri defense collapsed in the 12th. Santa Clara had only one hit. Tom Cullen's leadoff single, and Mizou committed three errors as the Broncos rushed to victory.

Giants Spin From Slump; Sweep Twin-Bill 2-1, 7-5

The San Francisco Giants seem to have recovered from that June swoon. The Los Angeles Dodgers may still be suffering from the shock of that Braves' barrage.

Halting the tailspin in which they dropped out of the National League lead, the Giants snapped their six-game losing streak Tuesday night, sweeping a doubleheader from Cincinnati 2-1 and 7-5 and moving back within a game of the first-place Dodgers.

The Dodgers, rolling with seven victories in nine games and 20 in 24, ran into a 17-hit, five-homer Milwaukee outburst behind Lew Burdette's six-hit pitching and lost a game and a half of their lead with a 15-2 clobbering by the Braves.

The defending champion Reds fell from third place to fifth. Pittsburgh moved into third, 7½ behind, by edging the Chicago Cubs 4-3 and St. Louis nipped Philadelphia 3-2 to take over fourth.

Houston defeated New York's Mets 3-2.

In the American League, the New York Yankees regained first place by beating Detroit 2-1 while Minnesota was losing to the Los Angeles Angels 7-5.
