Trial Jury Finds Schwensen Guilty

PORTLAND (AP) — Richard B. Schwensen, 27, was convicted of first degree murder Wednesday by a Circuit Court jury that made no recommendation for leniency.

Schwensen, tried for the death last September of Mrs. Jean Rosaria Bussey, 29, now faces the gas chamber unless the verdict is overturned by the State Supreme Court.

Appeal to the high court from a death sentence is automatic.

The jury of seven women and five men took just under 24 hours to reach the verdict. Schwensen met the announcement of the verdict with the same lack of emotion he displayed throughout the trial.

When he was led from the courtroom, he made a wry thumbs down gesture.

The prosecution contended that Schwensen had caused Mrs. Bussey's death in a rape or rape attempt.

Circuit Court Judge Arno Denekke instructed the jurors that they could decide the case on that question, even if they were unsure of the exact cause of death — a point that brought conflicting testimony from medical experts.

Pathologists testifying for the state said Mrs. Bussey died of an air embolism (air bubbles in the bloodstream). A defense witness said that was not the cause of death.

Starlet Of Movie 'Lolita' Was Banned From Premiere

NEW YORK (UPI) — A curvaceous 15-year-old blonde tried unsuccessfully Wednesday night to see the premiere of the "For adults only" film version of the controversial novel "Lolita."

The pretty girl was Suelyn (Sue) Lyon who plays the title role of a teen-age temptress in the movie.

For Sue, the premiere was a short one. The movie makers put a "For adults only" tag on the film and in a novel bit of press agency, banned the star from her own premiere.

The young actress got as far as the lobby of Loew's State Theater, was ushered into an office and then left the theater with her mother and a tutor.

Sue's mother and tutor described the star as a tomboy who goes up stairs three at a time, wears blue jeans, likes mathematics, and teaches tricks to a pet chihuahua.

Sue was anxious about the re-

views when they came out although she protested that she never worried and was "completely satisfied" with her own performance.

She went through the papers quickly and listened intently as the reviews were read. Most of them were good, but the New York Times made a few disparaging remarks.

"That review made me feel like a six year old that just had a lollipop snatched from its mouth," said Sue. "But I guess you have to take the good with the bad."

Two Sex Crimes Can Lead To Life Term

SALEM (AP) — A person who commits two sex crimes can be sentenced to life in prison as a sex offender, even though one of the offenses is a misdemeanor punishable by only a jail sentence.

The Oregon Supreme Court made this ruling today in holding that Roger Willard Jensen, sentenced in Lane County, must serve life.

Jensen was sentenced in 1956 to five years for contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

Two years later, he got six months for indecent exposure.

Then former Circuit Judge A. T. Goodwin, now a Supreme Court justice, revoked the six months' sentence, and gave Jensen a life sentence.

The Supreme Court, in an opinion by Justice Kenneth O'Connell, said the fact that the second offense was a misdemeanor doesn't make any difference.

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
