

Gold Cup-Football Classic Featured At World's Fair

SEATTLE, Wash. — (Special) — The richest Gold Cup in hydro racing history and a pre-season National Football League between Minnesota and San Francisco are the sports highlights of Seattle's World's Fair.

Sponsored by Greater Seattle, Inc., and the Seattle Yacht Club, the 54th running of the Gold Cup for unlimited hydroplanes on Sunday, Aug. 5, has drawn a large field of entries from Michigan, Indiana, California, and the Pacific Northwest.

Racing at speeds up to 180 miles per hour, the big boats provide one of sportdom's great thrills, and are an annual fixture during Seattle's ten day Saffair celebration. The races, which are held on beautiful Lake Washington, provide the climax to the colorful maritime festival.

A week later, on Saturday, Aug. 11, the titans of the gridiron invade the 55,000-seat University of Washington stadium for the seventh annual Greater Seattle, Inc. summer football classic.

Pitting the exciting "shotgun offense" of the San Francisco 49ers against the explosive attack of the sophomore Minnesota Vikings, the game will mark the return to UW stadium of Hugh McElhenny.

Considered one of pro football's all-time greats, McElhenny earned all-America honors while play-

ing for the Huskies. Nicknamed "The King," McElhenny was traded to Minnesota last year by the 49ers and his play in 1961 indicated the move may have been a mistake.

Davies Represents U.S. In Amateur Semifinals

HOYLANE, England (UPI) — Richard Davies, 31, a real estate executive from Pasadena, Calif., reached the semi-finals of the British Amateur Golf Championship today with a rain-soaked 2 and 1 victory over David Palmer of England.

The victory pitted Davies against Rodney, Foster, 20, of England in this afternoon's semi-finals. Foster advanced with a 6 and 4 triumph over Dr. Colin Bird of Scotland. John Poval of Wales played Brian Chapman of England in the other semifinal.

This marked the sixth straight year and the 16th time in the 17 tournaments since World War II that the United States has placed a representative in the semifinals. The only year America missed was in 1956.

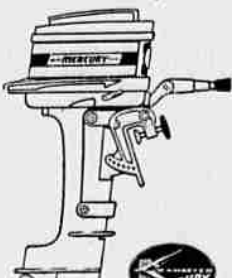
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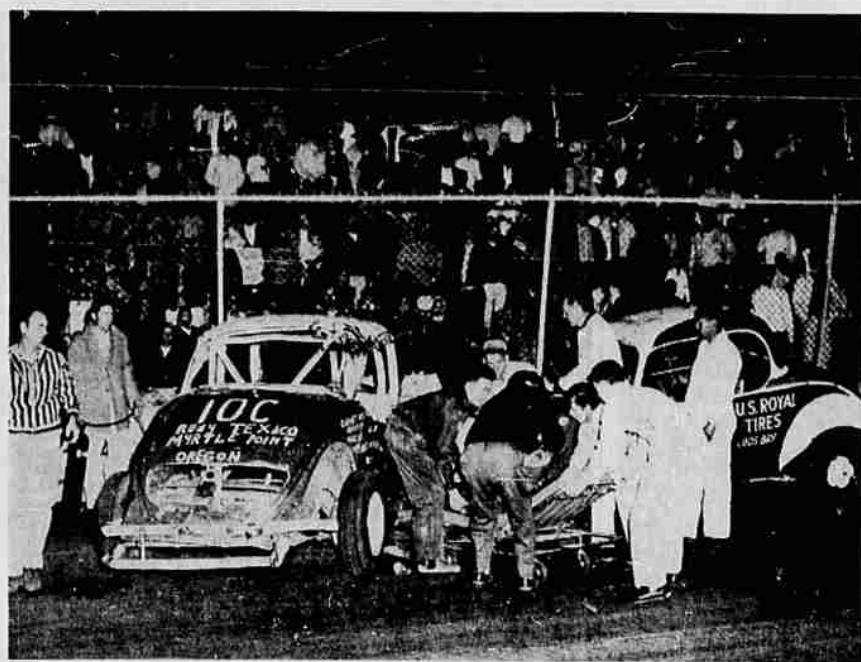

Don Hein, Roseburg, managed to do no better than a third place in the first heat race. Hein has been the driving champ at the Roseburg speedway for the past two seasons.

Hein will be out to break into the winner's circle this week when

the hardtops roar into action. Marion Shippey of Grants Pass and Jim Standley of Roseburg, the two double winners from the first week of racing, will be in action again trying to build up their point totals.

In addition to the local drivers, cars are expected from Grants Pass, Medford, Crescent City, Calif., Coos Bay, Coquille, Myrtle Point, Drain, Yoncalla, Reedsport, Cottage Grove, Bandon and Camas Valley.

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NCAA Track Test Opens Today; Oregon-USC Team Duel Expected

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene—The stage is set for the 41st annual NCAA track and field championships, scheduled for Hayward Field today and Saturday, with close to 300 athletes representing 92 schools ready to battle for individual and team honors.

The University of Southern California, paced by two-time shot put champion Dallas Long and quarter miler Rex Cawley, is the defending team titlist, but pre-meet dope points to a possible unseating of the Trojans by host Oregon.

Coach Bill Bowerman's Webfoots have qualified 22 athletes, more than any other school, for the meet and have defending champs Dwyer Burleson in the mile and Jerry Tarr in the high hurdles to spark their title push.

USC ranks second in the number of qualifiers with 18 and it appears the Ducks, Trojans, and Villanova will fight it out for the team championship.

Villanova's outside hopes of grabbing the team title hinge to a great extent on sprinter Frank Budd as he attempts to repeat in both the 100 and 220.

One of the most exciting of the flat races promises to be the 100, where Budd faces extremely rough opposition. Budd, co-holder of the world record at 9.2, was beaten by Robert Hayes, Florida A & M sophomore, at the Coliseum Relays and Hayes, in turn, was defeated by Oregon's Harry Jerome at Modesto.

All three will be in action this weekend, along with a darkhorse contender who also holds a win over Hayes this spring. He's Roger Sayers from Omaha Uni-

versity, who whipped the Florida A & M dynamo at the NAIA meet several weeks ago.

Another exciting race should be the 440-yard dash where Adolph Plummer of New Mexico and Abilene Christian's Earl Young renew their rivalry.

Plummer captured the NCAA 440-yard title last year at Philadelphia as Young's furious stretch drive fell inches short of victory. Not to be overlooked is Cawley, who blends speed and experience.

The meet will feature a trio of greats in search of third consecutive NCAA crowns. Long, the world record holder in the shot, Burleson, undisputed collegiate mile king, and Boston U's John Thomas in the high jump are all after national title number three.

A pair of competitors to watch are Jerry Dyes, Abilene Christian's versatile sophomore, and C. K. Yang, the decathlon star from UCLA. Dyes will be entered in the javelin, broad jump, and hop, step

and jump and is a potential point winner in all three.

Dyes, in fact, is a title threat in each event. He has bests of 25-9 1/4 in the broad jump, 248-6 1/2 in the javelin, and 49-11 1/4 in the hop, step, and jump.

Yang will compete in the javelin, pole vault, and high hurdles. His best efforts in those events this spring are 237-4, 14-6, and 14-1 respectively.
