Ingemar Buoyant After Win To Claim European Crown

GÖTEBORG, Sweden (AP)—Buoyant Ingemar Johansson took the European heavyweight title under his care today and said he had earned a rest before challenging either Floyd Patterson or Sonny Liston for the world championship.

Johansson was back as the pride of Sweden after demolishing tough Dick Richardson of Wales with an eighth-round knockout in the open air Ullevi Stadium Sunday night.

Ingo, boxing with cool calculation despite a cut left eye, dethroned the Welshman with a display of sheer power punching. More than 50,000 fans cheered him to the deep blue sky.

"Ingo is better now than he was in all of his three world title fights against Patterson," said Whitey Bimstein, Johansson's American trainer.

Johansson, riding high after three knockout victories since he went on the comeback trail, told reporters:

"I want to fight Patterson or Liston, whoever wins the title match in September."

"But I have been training and fighting hard for the past year and I think I deserve a short lay-

Burleson Reports No Summer Runs

EUGENE, Ore. (UPI)—One of the most consistent record-shattering athletes in America, shot-putter Dallas Long of USC, takes his special talent to the National AAU track and field meet this weekend—but another will sit it out.

Miller Dyrrol Burleson of Oregon announced Sunday that he would not compete in any track events this summer. He thus eliminated himself from the AAU meet in Southern California and the international meet between the United States and Russia in July.

Burleson announced his plans after winning the NCAA mile crown here Saturday with a time of 3:58.2.

Burleson cracked the four-minute barrier for the fifth time in winning the mile on Saturday as he helped Oregon to the NCAA team championship.

Long shattered his own NCAA shot-put mark with a heave of 64 feet, 7 inches. In seven heaves during two days he was past the 60-foot mark every time.
