Population May Reduce Forest, Farm Lands

LONGVIEW (UPI)—An area the size of the entire commercial forest land of Washington may be withdrawn from forest and cropland production in the United States in the next 10 years to satisfy the demands of an exploding population, T. H. Mutchler said recently.

Mutchler, chairman of the Washington Committee of American Forest Products Industries, Inc., made the statement in commenting on a land use report prepared by the AFPI.

"New highway construction, factories and our exploding suburban areas are enveloping two million acres every year," he said. "Simple arithmetic shows that in 10 years we will have lost an area national equal in size to Washington's 19 million acres of commercial forest land."

He said this withdrawal did not include those areas currently under consideration as wilderness or recreation preserves.
