

Bend 9 Captures Holiday Tournament Crown

Tigard Nips Roseburg; Meets Bend In Finals

Legion squads from Bend and Tigard moved into Wednesday's finals of the Roseburg Holiday Tournament, as the two teams dropped Albany and Roseburg into the consolation bracket.

Bend opened Tuesday evening's action by squeaking by a stubborn Albany club, 8-7, and Tigard clinched the evening by ousting last year's tourney winner, Roseburg, 3-1.

While the first game was a free-wheeling affair, the fans saw two fine pitchers clash in a pitcher's duel in the nightcap. Roseburg's Tom Hobbs and Tigard's Lee Helstrom locked horns in a game that saw each team garner only four hits.

In capturing the win, Helstrom gave up one run, while fanning 12 and walking 12. Although Helstrom had control troubles, he came through when needed, as he left 14 Roseburg baserunners stranded.

Hobbs' downfall came from the support given him by his teammates. All three Tigard runs came across on Roseburg miscues. Dropping his first game in seven decisions, Hobbs struck out eight and issued two base on balls.

After going hitless in the first three frames, Tigard combined two hits with one Lockwood error

to notch its first unearned run. Jerry Fairbanks doubled and came around with the game's first tally on a Roseburg miscue.

By chalking up two more markers in the sixth inning, the local team's chances darkened even more. This time Tigard put together two hits with two Roseburg bobbles to tally the two runs. Ed Mardock opened with a single, Fairbanks drew a base on balls and Larry Ryan singled to load the sacks. Mardock came home on an infield error and Fairbanks tagged up and slid in safely on an outfield fly.

The Lockwood Motors nine spoiled Helstrom's shutout by pushing a single counter across in the bottom of the sixth frame. Glen Fortune and Marv French drew back-to-back base on balls and Doug Coplin singled to drive home Fortune.

Coplin was Roseburg's big stickler in the game, nabbing two singles in three appearances at the plate. Jim Beamer and Tom Hobbs socked Lockwood's only other two bingles.

Two seven run innings, one by each team, made the game between Albany and Bend a wild contest. Albany tallied seven runs in the second frame by virtue of five safeties and three walks. Bend came up in the fifth frame to garner seven runs on two hits, two errors and four base on balls.

But the run that made the difference was one scored back in the first inning by the Bend contingent. Kurt Larson, the game's first batter, walked and came around with what turned out to be the deciding run.

Albany's Ralph McKechnie and Bend's Andy Cleveland led their respective teams, both hitting safely twice in four attempts. McKechnie's two hits produced three of Albany's seven markers.

Bend Edges Tigard 4-3 Lockwoods Places Third

With fireworks coming earlier in the day than expected, Bend captured the Legion Holiday Tournament Wednesday by sneaking past Tigard 4-3. Preceding the championship contest Lockwood Motors of Roseburg took consolation honors by downing Albany 6-2.

The fireworks came on plays that cost Tigard two runs in the title game—both as the result of runners not touching bases. In the fifth inning Mike Moore crossed home with what would have been the tying run, but was called out for failing to tag second. Again in the sixth inning Tigard scored the tying run, but this time Dick Funderhude missed the plate.

Bend took advantage of the breaks and held on to win the championship. The Murray Construction team of Bend outlasted Tigard 8-3 and left eight runners stranded, while Tigard left three men on base.

Led by four consecutive bingles, Bend took an early two-run lead in the second inning. Dick Nicholas, Pete Migan, Val Lewis and Dave Hebert connected for the four singles in the inning. Nicholas came home on Lewis' single and Migan crossed the plate on Hebert's base blow.

Tigard Comeback
Tigard retaliated in the bottom of the second with one run of its own. Mike Day was hit by the pitcher, moved to second when Mike Ager was hit by a pitched ball and romped home when the pitcher fielded a ground ball and threw wildly to third base.

Bend, with Nicholas doing the honors, scored a single run in the fourth on a round tripper that was hit over the fence some 360 feet away.

Tenmile Pee Wees Lose Pair To Glide

The Tenmile Pee Wees lost both ends of a twin-bill to the invading Glide contingent by scores of 20-6 and 23-17.

Pyle and Huseby handled the pitching for the winners. In the second outing the score was tied at the end of five innings, but the rampaging Glide Pee Wees scored seven runs in the top of the sixth, and Tenmile could counter with only one marker.

In an exhibition game the Tenmile Little League team and the Tenmile Pee Wee team split a doubleheader, reports correspondent Mrs. Walter Coates.

The Tenmile girls softball team ended on the short end of a 24-13 score in its recent outing against the host Winston team.

Scoring once more in the fifth inning, Bend moved in front by a 3-1 count. Mike Love doubled, went to third on a single by Andy Cleveland and scored when Nicholas collected his third hit of the day.

Closing in on Bend's three run bulge, Tigard managed to bring home two runners in the fifth frame. Mike Ager reached first on an error, Bob Webber and Moore walked to fill the bases. Ed Mardock doubled to drive home two of the three baserunners.

Temperatures Soar
Although the scoring was done for the day, the action was not. When Dick Funderhude was ruled out for not hitting home in the sixth inning, the dust flew. The entire Tigard team was off the bench and on the umpires. Some 10 minutes later, when the dust had

somewhat cleared, one Tigard player was put out of the game and a dejected Tigard team took the field.

Leading the tourney-winning Bend squad was Nicholas. He had a perfect day at the plate with two singles and a homer. Tigard's Mardock collected two of Tigard's three hits, as he doubled and singled.

Roseburg opened the day's playing by taking the consolation final against Albany. Lockwood Motors never behind in the contest. Jerry Boucock pitched the win for Lockwood Motors, scattering eight hits, while whiffing two and walking three.

Roseburg took the lead in the first inning when Marv French worked his way to a base on balls, stole second, moved to third on Gordon Avery's outfield fly and scored on an infield error.

Winning Runs

After Albany had gotten to Boucock for one in the second, the Lockwood Motors contingent tallied two more runs in the third frame. Avery walked and went to third on a single by Doug Coplin. Coplin moved to second on the throw to third. Avery tagged up and scored on a sacrifice fly off the bat of Jim Beamer and Coplin came home on a booming triple to center field by Bob Manning.

Roseburg put the game on ice in the fifth inning when they scored three times. Coplin walked, stole second and came around on Beamer's double off the left field boards. Manning walked and both around the bases on a long double by Lance Casebeer.

Staging a slight rally in its final chance at bat, Albany made the final count read 6-2. Four singles that came right in a row brought in the final Albany run.

Bob Manning and Lance Casebeer led the hitters for Lockwood Motors, with Manning going 2-2 and Casebeer 2-3. Brad Heckman was the only Albany hitter to rap two safeties, getting two singles in three times at bat.

Roseburg fans are in store for more action when Corvallis invades Roseburg for a non-league doubleheader scheduled Friday at 6:30 p.m. Saturday Roseburg will be looking to its Doug-Lane League lead when it plays South Eugene at 4:15 p.m. at Bethel Park in Eugene.
