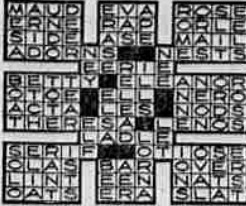

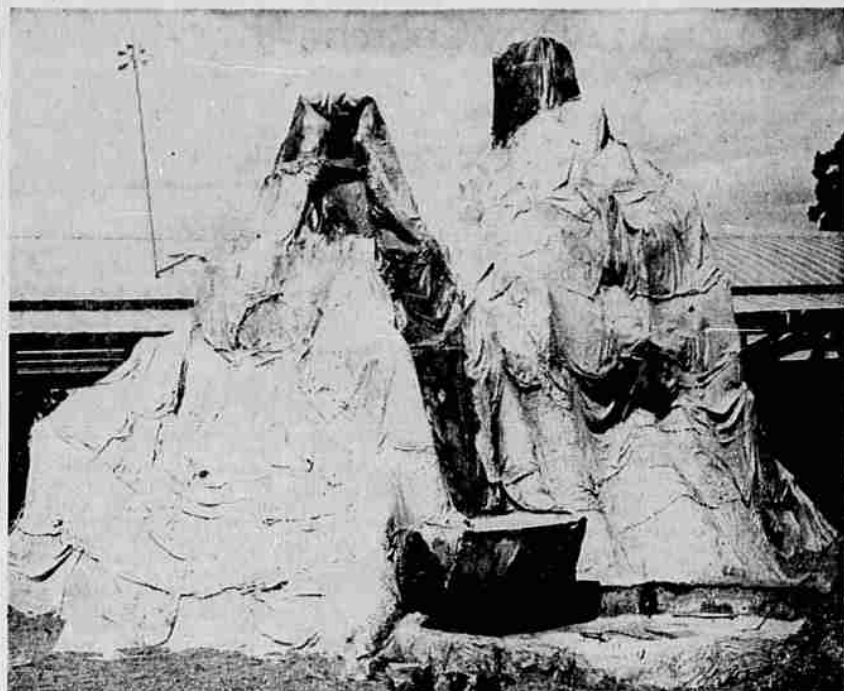

 And it appearing that a hearing was held on the formation of the proposed Riverdale Rural Fire Protection District on the 17th day of June, 1962, at ten o'clock on said day on the question of the proposed boundaries of said Riverdale Rural Fire Protection District and the Court having heard the discussions of the people present at said hearing:

IT IS ORDERED that the boundaries of said Riverdale Rural Fire Protection District shall be, as follows:
 All that portion of Section 3, 4, and 5 T. 27 S., R. 6 W., W.M., and Sections 31, 32, 33 and 34 T. 26 S., R. 6 W., W.M., described as beginning at the section corner common to Sections 3, 4, 9 and 10, T. 27 S., R. 6 W.; Thence easterly along the south line of section 3, T. 27 S., R. 6 W. to a point in the east line of the Jacob Jones D.L.C. No. 41; Thence northerly along the east line of the Jacob Jones D.L.C. No. 41 to the northeast corner of the south 1/2 of said Bethel Way D.L.C. No. 51; Thence northerly along the east line of said Bethel Way D.L.C. No. 51 to the northeast corner of the south 1/2 of said Bethel Way D.L.C. No. 51; Thence westerly along the north line of the south 1/2 of said Bethel Way D.L.C. No. 51 to the west R/W line of Garden Valley Road; Thence northwesterly along the westerly R/W line of said Garden Valley Road to its intersection with the south bank of the North Umpqua River; Thence westerly along the south bank of the North Umpqua River to its intersection with the east bank of the South Umpqua River; Thence southeasterly along the east bank of the South Umpqua River to its intersection with the south line of Section 4, T. 27 S., R. 6 W.; Thence easterly along the south line of said Section 4 to the point of beginning.

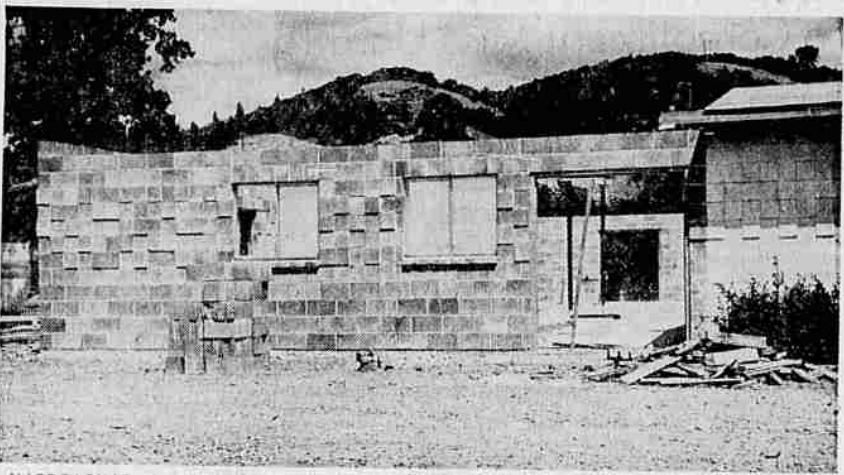

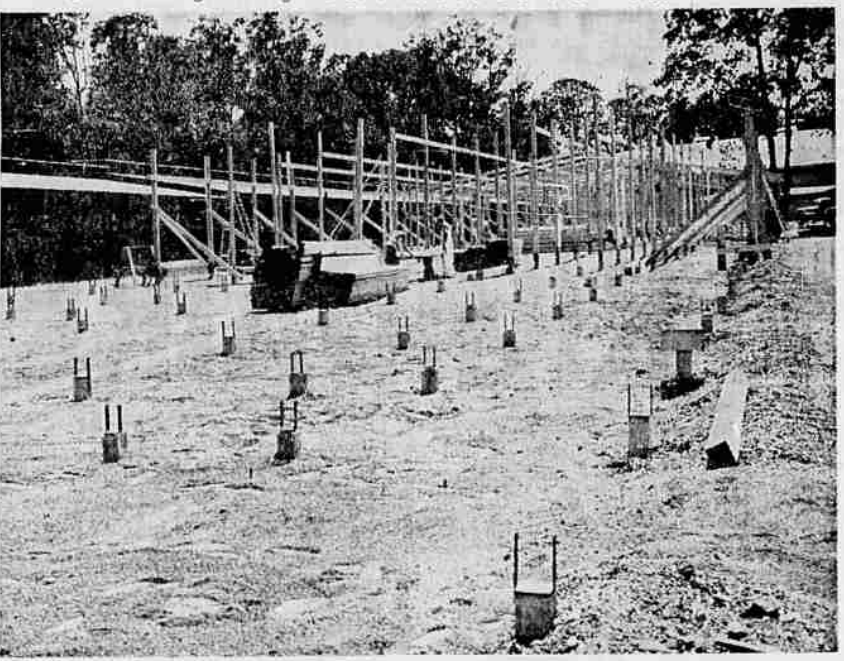

Cronise Was Former Resident Of County

Ralph R. Cronise, former publisher of the Albany Democrat-Herald, who died in Albany Tuesday after a long illness, once made his home in Douglas County.
 Born in Salem, Jan. 4, 1886, he attended University of Oregon.
 In 1911, he and a brother, Harry, filed on adjoining homesteads near Gladly. While proving up on their property they did some prospecting. Ralph taught school at Wilbur briefly and also sold life insurance. Selling the homestead in 1914 he returned to newspaper work, having served previously on newspapers in Salem and Eugene while attending school. He worked at Grants Pass and Portland prior to buying an interest in the Albany newspaper in 1919. He remained with the Albany newspaper after its sale to Elmo Smith, former Oregon governor, in 1957, in the capacity of editorial consultant.
