

Sherry Sevall Reaches Semifinals

Other Roseburg Stars Fall In State Jaycee Tournament

Sherry Sevall will carry the Roseburg hopes for a state championship today's semifinal round of the state Jaycee tennis tournament at Beaverton.

Miss Sevall, competing in the

Girls classification, drew a first round bye Friday, then topped Nancy Murch of Beaverton in the quarterfinal round. In the quarterfinal battle Miss Sevall won a two set victory by scores of 6-1 and 6-4.

Today Miss Sevall will take on another opponent in the semifinal round of the Girls division. If the Roseburg lass wins in the semifinals she will compete this afternoon for the state crown.

The Junior Boys action saw Doug Green open with a victory for the Roseburg contingent, but he returned to the courts later in the day and was dumped by Jim Barnes of Portland. Don Harris, the other local entrant in the Junior Boys division lost out in the first round to Bob Secout of Portland.
