

Lumberjills Take 4th In Softball Tourney

The Roseburg Lumberjills came home proud possessors of fourth place in the Invitational B Girls Softball Tournament held over the weekend at Eugene.

Roseburg opened Friday night against Portland's Rosebuds, and was sent into the losers bracket by virtue of a 17-8 setback. Saturday the Lumberjills came on strong to beat North Marion of Salem 10-1 and Aloha of Portland 8-7, before being eliminated 9-6 by Eugene.

The winner of the Rosebuds-Eugene game was to play the Miss Prints of Portland for the championship.

Fourth Inning

A 10-run explosion by the Rosebuds in the fourth inning of the opening game proved disastrous for the Lumberjills. The rally was set up by a Roseburg injury in the third inning. Joan Heeter was taken by ambulance to a Eugene hospital when she sprained a ligament sliding into third.

As the ambulance took Miss Heeter away, the Roseburg team had a few bad minutes — and this accounted for the uprising. The Rosebuds put together five hits, four errors and one walk for the 10 runs.

Brenda Solnika put the Jills in the winner's circle Saturday with a three-bitter against North Marion. The lone run against Miss Solnika came on a sixth-inning homer. Roseburg's ace chucker struck out six and walked two in grabbing the win.

Attack Leaders

Judy Zeigler led the 11-hit Roseburg attack against North Marion with two triples and two RBIs, while Joanne Davenport had a third-inning homer and a double for three RBIs.

In downing Aloha, 8-7, the Lumberjills scored twice in the final inning. Rexie Nicholson started the winning rally with a single, and on Miss Zeigler's bouncer the shortstop threw wild to second base allowing both runners to advance. Another hobble on a grounder by Miss Davenport brought in one run, while a sacrifice fly by Nancy Crenshaw scored the winning tally. Glenna Wolford tossed the win for Roseburg. The local lass gave up eight hits, but did not walk a batter.

Eugene bounced the Lumberjills from the tourney with a three-run rally in the top of the seventh. Eugene picked up four of its six hits in the ninth inning to win the game 9-6.

Led Lumberjills

For the tournament Miss Zeigler had seven hits in 17 at-bats to lead the Lumberjills. Miss Davenport and Sherrel McCoy each had five hits. For the four games Roseburg left 45 runners stranded on base.

A standout feature of the Lumberjills was the control of their pitchers. Miss Wolford walked only one batter in her games and Miss Solnika gave up 12 free passes.

Injuries hampered Roseburg, but coach Roy Grain praised Sue Webster and Paula McGhee for their performances in the outfield.

Sunday the Lumberjills will host the Eugene team, then the following week the Rogue River Dairy Maids will invade Roseburg.

Diane Yates had some bad luck

to finish fifth in the senior girls 50-yard freestyle event. Miss Yates was tied for first going into the turn, but a bad turn dropped her back to fifth at the finish line. Miss Yates' time was 31.1 seconds.

Second Place

In the senior girls freestyle relay, Pat Bissonnette and Miss Yates came from behind to lead Roseburg to a second place finish. Third places among the girls were won by Denise Doyle in the senior girls 200-yard freestyle. Miss

Yates in the senior girls individual medley, and Pat Bonebrake in the 11-12 50-yard backstroke.

Ron Frashour, Rob Williams and Bill Zimmerman starred for the Roseburg boys in competition. Frashour qualified with fifth best time in the boys 13-14 butterfly action, then in the finals came through with a second place. Frashour placed fourth in the 50-yard freestyle and fifth in the individual medley.

Williams was fourth in the boys

13-14 200-yard freestyle and sixth in the breast stroke race. Zimmerman came through with a second place in the senior boys 200-yard breast stroke and was fourth in the 200-yard freestyle.
