

Khrushchev Hints Soviets Will Be Ready For Test Ban Talks After New Series

MOSCOW (UPI) — Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev has hinted in an interview with American newspaper editors that Russia will be ready for serious nuclear test ban talks after the next Soviet test series.

He boasted to the editors that Russia has an anti-missile missile so accurate that it "hits a fly in outer space." He claimed, however, that no anti-rocket weapons could stop the Soviet Union's own "global rocket."

He said last Friday the Russians should be "the last to carry out nuclear weapons tests" because the United States exploded the first atomic weapon in 1945.

British Doctor In Canada As Medical Strike Adviser

SASKATOON, Sask. (UPI) — An architect of Britain's national health service arrived today as an "impartial" adviser to the provincial government in its increasingly bitter dispute with striking doctors.
