Newport Plans West-East Trek By Wagon Train

NEWPORT (UPI)—Five covered wagons will leave here in June, 1963, for a six-month trip across the country to Newport, R. I.

Newport Chamber of Commerce manager Bob Cooper said the idea originated with Mrs. Myrtle Morgan, of Portland, following lengthy research for her book, "Heritage Road of America."

The book tells of the Oregon Trail, the Santa Fe Trail and other great routes of the pioneers.

Dave Gastman, Damascus, former head wrangler of the Oregon Centennial Wagon Train which traveled from Independence, Mo., to Independence, Ore., in 1959, will be trail boss of the Newport train.

Cooper said this would be the first recorded passage of a wagon train from the West Coast to the East Coast.

Peace candles from the Little World's Fair at Damascus will be distributed along the path of the wagon train. The train is scheduled to arrive in Rhode Island in December, 1963. When the President lights the White House Christmas tree, the peace candles along the route of the train would be lit, Cooper said.

Newport and Damascus are to provide one wagon and Oregon, California, Washington and Idaho will be asked to provide one wagon each.
