

John Barron Makes Speedway Sweep

Racing Ace Captures Firsts In Trial, Dashes, A-Main

Roseburg's John Barron completely wiped out the other drivers in Saturday's hardtop action at the Roseburg Speedway.

Barron's 19.11 seconds time in the time trials earned him first time for the evening as he started on his clean sweep.

The local ace returned to the track to leave the field in his dust in the third heat race, then did the same to top drivers competing in the fast and final heat race. Barron also added the A-Trophy Dash to his credits for the evening.

Domination Complete
The A-Main saw Barron com-

plete his domination. Barron barreled into an early lead, and went on to lap several of the other cars entered. He received the checkered flag which signified him as the winner, racing home well ahead of Hein of Roseburg and third place winner Rocky Ford Plant of Roseburg.

An official protest against Barron's car was filed at the completion of the races, but when the motor was torn down at a local garage the engine was found to be legal and Barron added \$25 to his winnings, collecting the money which was put up with the protest.

Plant was victorious in the B-Main event for the hardtops, while Sam Gosso won the main event for the jalopies. Bob Voss, driving car 54, outlasted the other jalopies in the featured destruction derby. The jalopies and hardtops will be in action again July 28 at the Roseburg Speedway.

Giants Blast Four
A pair of them helped the Los Angeles Dodgers retain their two game lead in the NL with a 13-6 victory over the Chicago Cubs, while the San Francisco Giants hammered four homers in a 5-4 decision over the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Seven homers were hit as Milwaukee took two from Philadelphia 11-10 and 5-2, and St. Louis beat Houston, 3-1, in the only major league contest that was homerless. Baltimore snapped Minnesota's six game winning streak, 8-6, the Chicago White Sox bumped the Boston Red Sox, 7-3, and the Kansas City A's routed the Detroit Tigers, 11-3.

Harry Bright's three-run homer in the first inning plus the four-hit pitching of rookie Dave Stenhouse gave the Senators their opening game victory over the Yankees. The loss halted a nine-game Yankee winning streak and the Senators saw to it that the Yanks didn't get another one started by beating them in the nightcap on homers by Jim King, Chuck Hinton and pitcher Bennie Daniels.

Two-run homers by Willie Kirkland and Jerry Kindall off Don Lee of the Angels provided the Indians with their first victory in 10 games. Jim Perry (8-7) was the winner although he needed Gary Bell's help after Billy Moran homered in the seventh.

Mets Blow Lead

The poor Mets jumped to a 4-0 lead against the Reds in their opener but Cincinnati came up with a six-run rally in the sixth to clinch that one. Joe Nuxhall, the winning pitcher, celebrated his return to the Reds by pitching three scoreless innings and hitting a two-run double.

The blow that hurt Casey most, though was a pinch homer by Mary Keough in the ninth inning of the nightcap. It came off reliever Roger Craig, snapped a 3-all tie and ran the Reds' winning streak to five games. Vada Pinson also homered for Cincinnati.
