

Case Of Hepatitis Reported In County

One case of infectious hepatitis was reported in Douglas County during the week ending July 14, the Oregon State Board of Health noted in its latest weekly Communicable Disease Summary.

The case brings to 23 the total number of such cases in Douglas County for the year. A total of 13 cases was reported in the state

for the last week noted. The state total for the year is 59 cases.

A drop in the number of pneumonia cases reported was noted in the last summary. Two cases were reported, compared with six cases for the previous week. Also 11 cases of influenza were reported compared with 12 the previous week.

One case of German measles was reported in the last week.
