

Curry County Triumphs 17-6 In Babe Ruth Game

By capturing a 17-6 verdict over an outmanned South Douglas club Thursday night, Curry County moved into second round action of the double elimination District IV Babe Ruth tournament and will collide with the Roseburg entrant at 8:30 tonight.

At 8:30 the North Douglas County and South Douglas County teams will square off in a contest which will oust one of the two squads from competition. All remaining games are scheduled to

be played at Legion Field in Roseburg.

Errors played an important role in Curry County's victory, as the South Douglas contingent fumbled the ball to the tune of nine errors. Hits were well divided, although Curry County got its hits at the more opportune moments. Hits favored Curry County 16-12.

The Curry County team knocked out six of its hits in the second inning. Those six hits, combined with five South Douglas miscues, accounted for five runs.

South Douglas' big frame was also the second as it managed to push four of the six runs across the plate. South Douglas garnered these four runs on four bingles.

Leading the winning Curry County nine at the plate was Allen Payne, who pounded out four hits in five times at bat, including a roundtripper and a triple. Bob McNeely also swatted 4-5, while Herb Payne and Barry Evanson rapped out 2-5.

The big sticks for the losers were John Ringen of Canyonville with 2-3 and John Benson of Days Creek with 2-4.

As this is a double elimination tournament, no team is out of the running for the top spot. It is entirely possible for either South or North Douglas to come back and pick up all the marbles.

Diamond Lake Trout Reported Doing Well

Rainbow trout planted in Diamond Lake in May are showing up quite well in current creel checks.

Jerry Bauer, biologist in the Game Commission's regional office in Roseburg, who is conducting studies at Diamond Lake, says fish planted the third week in May are making up 25 per cent of the catch by anglers at the popular resort.

An unexplained "upset" in water of the lake last year killed off the greater part of the season's fingerlings, fish which should be supplying the bulk of this year's catch, Bauer says.

This year the Game Commission started replacing the Kamloops trout, with which the lake was planted after it had been poisoned for the elimination of trash fish. Kamloops are being replaced with native rainbow trout. The rainbow spawns earlier and recovers faster than the Kamloops, so is in better condition by the time the season arrives, Bauer reports. Rainbows also have other superior features.

Fish which were five and six inches when planted the latter part of May, now are from seven to nine inches, Bauer states. They are fat and sleek and weigh up to one-fourth pound.

Angling has been extremely poor.

Bauer reported. Earlier creel checks revealed only 3 fish per angler. Recently there has been a slight gain. Present counts are .5 fish per angler.

Reds Win Ninth Straight; Yankees Fatten AL Lead

It's about time that the Cincinnati Reds should be taken seriously as a threat to win their second straight National League pennant.

They're still eight games behind the front-running Los Angeles Dodgers but they're the hottest team in the league with nine straight wins. And a team that flourished in the early months of the season is beginning to "jell" for manager Fred Hutchinson.

The Reds rolled to their ninth straight victory Thursday night when they beat the Pittsburgh Pirates, 5-3, with the aid of two-run homers by Jerry Lynch and Gordie Coleman. The triumph gave the Reds a sweep of their four-game series with the Pirates.

Braves Whipped Mets

The Milwaukee Braves whipped the New York Mets, 6-1, in the only other National League game while the New York Yankees slaughtered the Boston Red Sox, 13-3, and the Chicago White Sox beat the Washington Senators, 7-1, in the only American League games.

TO JOIN ANGELS

DETROIT (UPI) — Outfielder-third baseman George Thomas, recently discharged from the Army, is expected to join the Los Angeles Angels here today. Thomas, a former member of the Detroit Tigers, hit .274 and 13 home runs last year.

Bob Skinner homered for the Pirates in the first inning but the Reds came back with Lynch's two-run homer and Coleman's solo shot to take a lead they never lost. Johnny Klippstein went 7-13 in innings and got fine relief pitching from Bill Henry in the eighth and ninth to win his second game of the season while Vern Law suffered his sixth loss.

Warren Spahn, 41-year-old dean of the NL pitchers, registered his 10th win of this season and the 319th of his career against the hapless Mets, who lost their 11th straight game.

It was a breeze for Spahn, who

also hit an NL record pitchers' high. He connected for his 31st homer. Hank Aaron also homered for the Braves.

Yankees Fatten Lead

Clete Boyer's two-run homer capped a wild third-inning rally during which the Yankees scored eight runs with two out and fattened their AL lead to three games over the idle Los Angeles Angels.

Boyer had three hits and Tom Tresh, Hector Lopez, Elston Howard and the Yankees' 12-hit attack. Jim Bouton, aided by Bob Turley's late-inning relief, won his fourth game against two losses for the Yankees.

Ray Herbert became the White Sox' first 10-game winner of the year with his six-hit victory over the Senators. Al Smith homered for the White Sox and Bob Johnson connected for the Senators, whose Bennie Daniels lost his 11th decision of the season.
