U. S. Grant Asked For New Sea Lab

SALEM (UPI) — Application for a federal grant to construct an Oregon State University oceanography laboratory at Newport on Yaquina Bay was announced this week by the State Department of Planning and Development.

The request for \$921,650 was made to the Area Redevelopment Administration.

Planning and development Director Sam Mallicoat said the project conforms to the overall economic development plan for Lincoln County and would provide

40 jobs during construction and 57 after it goes into operation.

The laboratory will include space for oceanography research, fisheries and pollution research, moorage of vessels and an area for the public which will include a museum and a small auditorium.

State higher education officials had been asked to consider the abandoned Tongue Point Naval Station as a possible site for the laboratory, but stood by their original choice of Yaquina Bay.

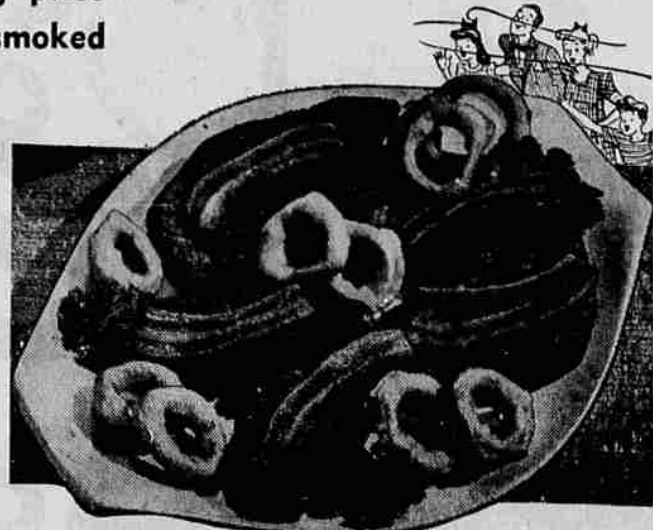

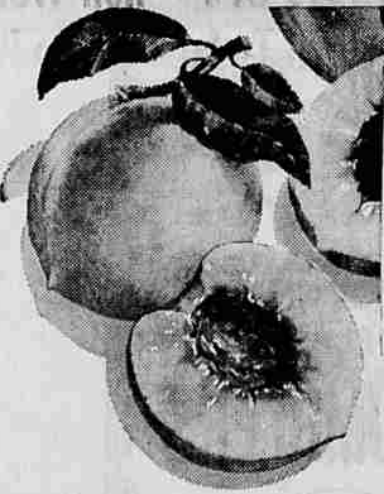
