## Kennedy Honors Physician Who Stopped Sinister Drug

WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Kennedy today conferred the nation's highest award for civilian service on Dr. Frances Oldham Kelsey for her role in the Thalidomide case.

Dr. Kelsey, 48, is credited with suspecting its dangers and keeping it off the market for more than a year, despite what the Department of Health, Education and Welfare termed "very vigorous" efforts by its manufacturer.

BEA BREAKS PRECEDENT LONDON (UPI)—Augustin Cardinal Bea Sunday became the first Roman Catholic cardinal in more than 400 years to enter Lambeth Palace, London seat of the Anglican archbishop of Canterbury.

Theodore C. Sorensen, special counsel to the President, spoke to an estimated 500 persons who paid \$25 a plate to hear him Monday night at the meeting's major fundraising banquet.

Sorensen admitted criticism of the President has increased in recent months but he said "President Kennedy is not concerned about his critics but about his country."

Dr. Michael Ramsey, the archbishop and head of the Church of England, lunched with the cardinal, president of the Vatican Secretariat for the Unity of Christian Churches.

Peter T. Jones, deputy undersecretary of commerce for trade policy, explained the Kennedy administration's foreign trade bill to a conference session Monday.

Sorensen added "all of our greatest presidents in their time were bitterly abused and hated and rejected." He said the administration has been a success in spite of recent reverses in Congress.
