Oregon VA Names Research Director

SALEM (UPI)—Dr. David G. Berger, executive director of the research unit of the Veterans Administration at Perry Point, Md., has been named as Oregon's first institution research coordinator.

In his new position the 40-year-old Berger will plan, organize and coordinate research programs at Oregon institutions administered by the Board of control.

Federal and foundation grants will be sought to finance the program.

Berger is being hired under a 4½-year grant from the National Institute of Mental Health.

The new job, authorized by the 1961 legislature, pays from \$12,840 to \$15,420 a year.

Berger is a graduate of Western Reserve University and holds a doctor of philosophy degree from Michigan State University. He will begin his work in Salem Monday.
