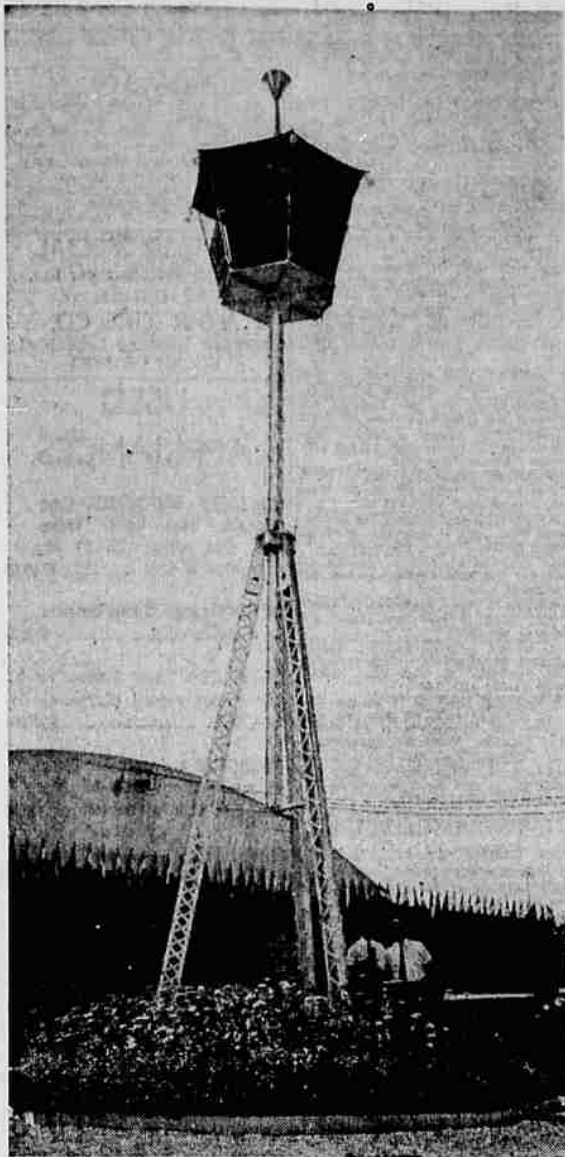
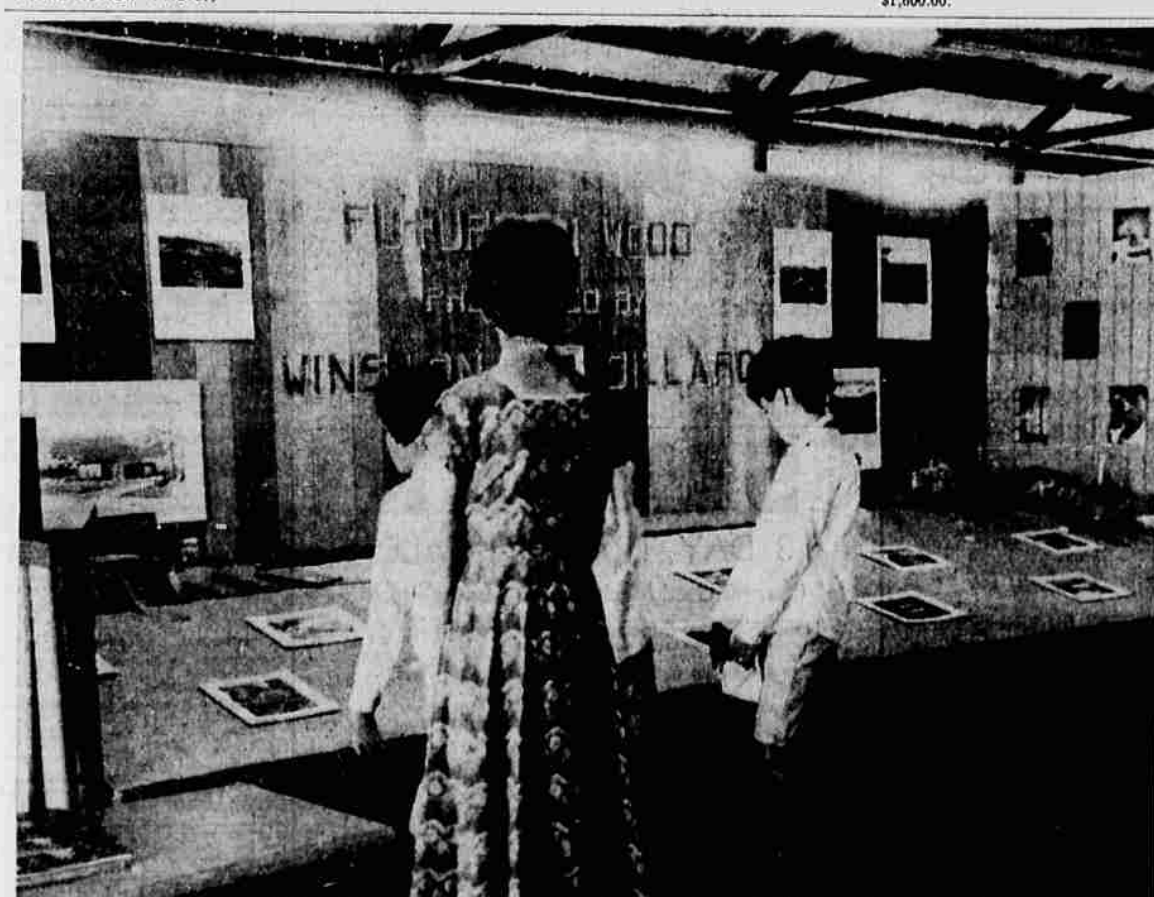

Incidence Of Influenza Shows Slight Decrease

Incidence of influenza in Douglas County lessened slightly during the week ending Aug. 4, according to the Oregon State Board of Health.

During the last week, nine cases of "flu" were reported compared with 14 cases for the previous week. The state total also is down to 120 cases from 157.

In the last week noted, one case of pneumonia and three cases of whooping cough were reported.

The last summary from the board indicated one case of non-infectious meningitis. The case occurred in a 5-day old child which died.
