## Tankers Collide In Scheldt River

FLUSHING, Holland (UPI)—A Panamanian tanker loaded with a cargo of crude oil collided with a British tanker in the Scheldt River Monday, turning both vessels into flaming torches and blocking access to the giant Belgian port of Antwerp. As many as 27 men may have died in the crash.

The Panamanian vessel was the 20,776-ton Miraflores, and the British tanker was the 13,350-ton Abadesa. The Miraflores had a full load of crude inbound from the Persian Gulf to Antwerp. The Abadesa was outbound from Antwerp without cargo.

Twenty-seven members of the Miraflores' 53-man crew were plucked from the freezing waters of the river, along with the Bel-seaman died after he was pulled out of the water.

There was no immediate word on the missing crewmen, but most of the rescued men suffered severe burns and shock.

There was no word on the fate of the Abadesa's crew.

The busy Scheldt waterway which connects the port of Antwerp with the North Sea was transformed into a pool of flame by the collision, and all shipping on the stretch of river between Saftingen and Baalhoek was blocked.
