Headline Hurried Distance Dialing

Quoted in the story was Cliff Thomas, manager of the Roseburg office of Pacific Northwest Bell. He said DDD, by which a long distance call can be made to another city by dialing instead of through an operator, is tentatively programmed here in 1966. He said the switchover might take place sooner because of technical advances, but it also depends, he said, on investment money available and resituation of employees.

Some question has arisen as to why the Park Lawn Memorial Gardens suit was filed in this county, even if the principal managing agent of both cemetery corporations, Robert A. Dudley, lives in Douglas County on Del Rio Road.

In asking to be relieved as trustee for the Park Lawn Memorial Gardens, the Commercial Bank claims that the cemetery corporations had failed to comply with the terms of the trusts by failing to file monthly statements of account.

The trust agreement for the Roseburg Memorial Gardens was originally set up with the Commercial Bank of Oregon on Nov. 9, 1954. The Oregon Bank later took over the trust. The U. S. National Bank of Portland was the original trustee for the Park Lawn Memorial Gardens as of Jan. 31, 1955, and the transfer was made to the Oregon bank May 22, 1962, after U. S. National resigned.
