

CIRCUIT COURT

Complaint

State of Oregon, by its Highway Commission, vs. J. M. and Jane Doe Housley; city of Roseburg, and Selmer Hutchins. Suit to condemn property owned by the city but in which the other named defendants have an interest, for widening of the Sutherlin-Shady section of the Pacific Highway. The property is in the vicinity of the Roseburg airport, in Edenbower Orchard Tracts. The state has offered \$500 for the property.

State of Oregon by its Board of Forestry vs. Silvester and Norma Hausman. Suit to condemn property for the construction of the Johannesen Creek Forest Road. The state offers \$750 for the property.

Ruth Purves Miller, vs. Jack Price Jr. Plaintiff asks general damages of \$45,000 and special damages of \$986.25 for injuries allegedly suffered Aug. 20, 1960 in an accident on Highway 99 in the vicinity of Myrtle Creek. Plaintiff states she was a passenger in a car operated by Ben Miller which collided with that of the Price car. She claims she suffered spine, neck, shoulder and other injuries, including shock to the nervous system.

State of Oregon by its Director of Veterans Affairs, vs. Robert M. Smith, Betty Smith, Henry R. Davis, Janet Davis, Peggy Davis, City of Sutherlin and Milt Staple. Plaintiff asks judgment from the Smiths and Davises for \$9,388.44, plus interest and costs and foreclosure on mortgage on property listed as Lots 12 and 13, Block 14, Amended Plat of Townsite of Sutherlin. Other named defendants claim an interest in the property. Davises were original purchasers, and mortgage assigned to the Smiths.

Robert C. LaDuke vs. Douglas County. Plaintiff demands \$75,000 general damages and \$5,044.10 special damages for injuries alleged suffered Aug. 21, 1962, when his car allegedly struck a sunken grade in the county road immediately north of the bridge crossing over Lookingglass Creek. The plaintiff claims that when his car struck this place it was caused to go out of control and to leave the roadway and to crash and collide with rocks and terrain along said roadway and to go into the ditch along the roadway. The location was three miles north of Brookway. Plaintiff claims he suffered extensive lacerations of the scalp, along with fractures of the cervical vertebrae and other injuries, which are of a permanent nature. Special damages are asked to cover hospital and doctor bills, and lost wages.

State of Oregon, acting by its Board of Forestry, vs. Martin E. Hill and Edna A. Hill, and Claire C. and Kathyteen R. Thurman. Suit to condemn property and assess value of defendant's land for improvement of Johannesen Creek Forest Road. Plaintiff offers \$2,500 compensation.

State of Oregon, by its Board of Forestry, Everett L. and Marilyn L. Wright; United States of America, acting through the Administrator of the Farmers Home Administration. Suit to condemn property and assess damages for improvement of Johannesen Creek Forest Road. Plaintiff offers \$4,000 as compensation.

State of Oregon vs. Clifford and Wilma Leach; Umpqua National Bank, Reedsport, and State of Oregon, by and through its State Tax Commission. Suit to condemn property needed for improvement of Johannesen Creek Road. State offers \$500.

Decree

Chester S. and Eugenia V. Witek vs. Woolley Logging Co. et al, and unknown heirs of defendants. Plaintiffs decreed owners of property. Suit to quiet title.

Judgment

John Bryant vs. State Industrial Accident Commission. Based on stipulation of parties, judgment entered granting plaintiff compensation for permanent partial disability equivalent to 100 per cent loss function of an arm for unscheduled disability. Claim remanded to defendant for compliance.

Leonard E. Fiscue vs. State Industrial Accident Commission. Based on stipulation, judgment entered that case be remanded to the commission granting plaintiff further medical treatment, including surgery, and that plaintiff be reinstated to temporary total disability status upon his reporting to a doctor for treatment pursuant to the commission's direction.

Order

Willis A. and Frances J. Erickson vs. John and Mary P. Rinaldi; Chris Wheeler, state engineer, and C. O. Bartels, state weighmaster. On stipulation of the Ericksons and Rinaldis, and compliance with provisions of previous order designating ownerships and rights to spring water in the vicinity of Hubbard Creek, final order entered designating the agreement and dismissing the case.

Dismissals

Douglas County vs. Leon K. Fink and Henry A. and Winifred Crane. On motion of the plaintiff, case dismissed as settled with prejudice and without costs. Case settled.

Eveyn Cline vs. Royal Neighbors of America. On stipulation of the parties, case dismissed as settled with prejudice and without costs.

Valma Hubbell vs. Francis J. Knoblauch. On motion of the plaintiff, case dismissed with prejudice and without cost to either, as settled.

Arthur R. Hubbell vs. Francis J. Knoblauch. On motion of plaintiff case dismissed with prejudice and without cost as settled.

A. R. Husband and Martha Ellen Husbands vs. Harry Sylvester and Cora L. Taylor. On motion of plaintiff, case dismissed with prejudice and without costs as settled.

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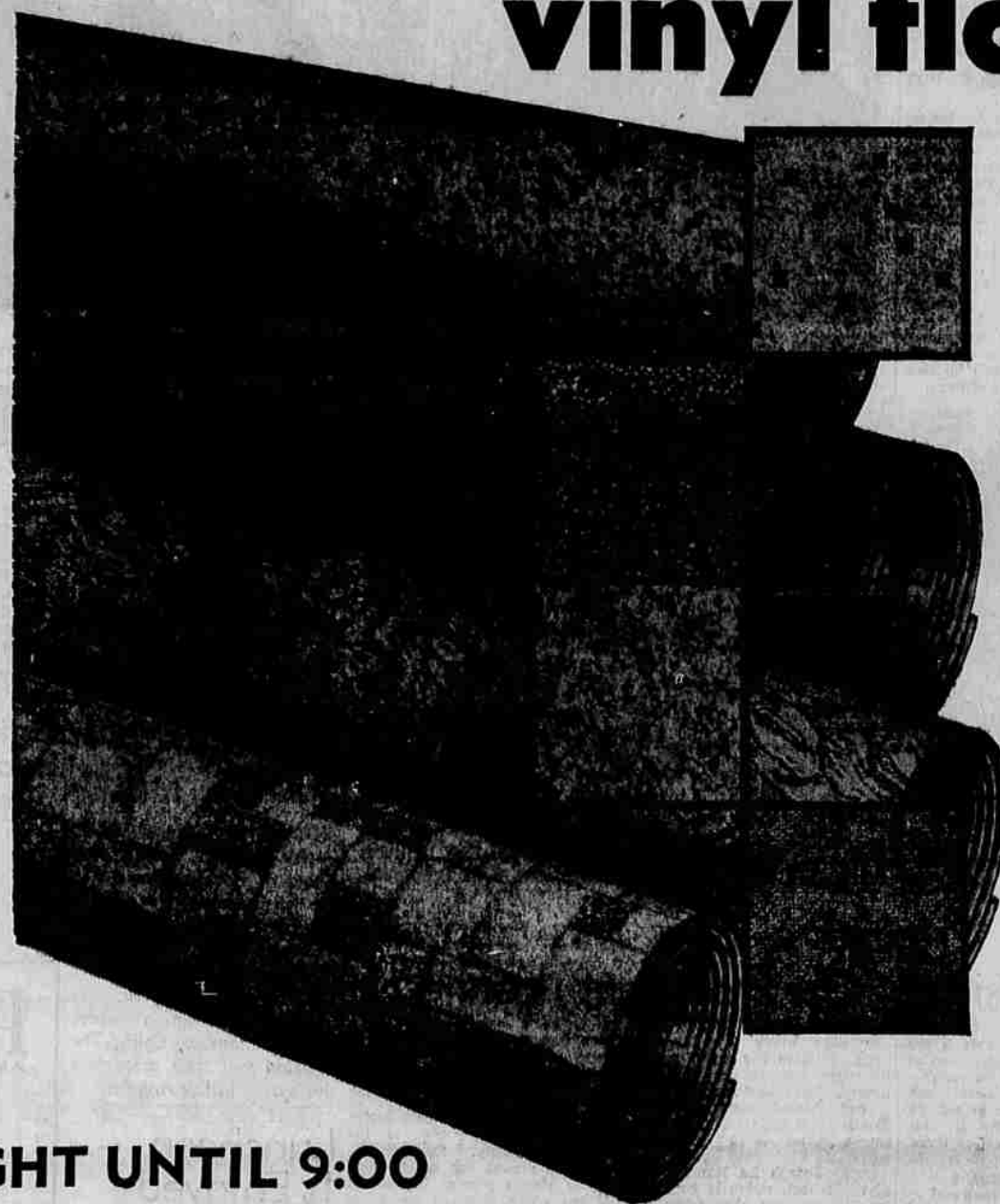
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
