**Lane County Youngster Believed Polio Victim**

EUGENE (UPI) — A case of paralytic polio has been diagnosed tentatively in a 10-year-old Cottage Grove boy, the Lane County Health Department announced.

The U.S. Public Health Service is conducting laboratory tests, which will take two to three weeks to confirm or refute the diagnosis.

It would be the first case of paralytic polio in Lane County since last August.

**Church At Winston Books Missionaries**

The Winston Foursquare Gospel Church will be host tonight to the Rev. and Mrs. Robert C. Tracy, missionaries for the denomination in Australia, now in this country on furlough. The Rev. Terry Littschwager, most pastor, has invited the public to attend the service scheduled for 7:30 p.m.

The Tracys have been in Australia since 1959 under appointment of the International Church of the Foursquare Gospel and are in the states on an itinerant program in the "land down under." In Friday's appearance they will highlight the activities of their ministry in Western Australia, a territory about the size of Texas, Sound films, colored slides and artifacts, the latter composed chiefly of weapons, musical instruments and native dress of the Australian Aborigines and New Guinea natives, will add interest to the meeting, according to Littschwager.

The visiting couple pioneered a Foursquare Church in Missouri prior to accepting the across-the-sea assignment. They supervise a Bible school, conduct a wide-flung evangelistic program from their headquarters in Perth, Australia, and also program a state-wide radio broadcast.

Following a series of missionary rallies in the United States, the Tracys will return to Australia later this year via England, Greece, Rome, and India, holding preaching services en route.
