## LeMay Picked As Air Force Chief Of Staff

WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Kennedy Monday named Gen. Curtis E. LeMay to a new one-year term as Air Force Chief of Staff. He nominated Adm. David L. McDonald as the next chief of naval operations.

McDonald, 56, will succeed Adm. George W. Anderson for a two-year term when Anderson's stint as a member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff expires Aug. 1. Anderson will have served two years.

The White House said Kennedy decided on a one rather than two-year extension for LeMay to "avoid for the future the coincidence of the terms of two chiefs expiring within the short period of one month." His current term expires July 1.

McDonald now is commander in chief of U.S. naval forces in Europe, the Eastern Atlantic and Mediterranean.

He was appointed to that post after serving two years as commander of the 6th fleet.

White House officials said Anderson had been offered a government position which Kennedy hoped the admiral would accept when his retirement takes effect.

The nominations of LeMay and McDonald must be confirmed by the Senate. Chief of Staff Gen. Earl G. Wheeler, he was named to a two-year term in October, 1962.

South had a definite reason for his four no-trump response. In case his partner could show three aces, South planned to bid six no-trump to stop a possibly dangerous lead through one of his red kings.

When North showed four aces, South also had a reason for bidding seven no-trump instead of seven spades. The game was duplicated and South wanted the extra

points for making the hand in no-trump.

## Nixon Buys 'Luxury' Apartment In New York

NEW YORK (UPI) — Former Vice President Richard M. Nixon has purchased a \$135,000 cooperative apartment in the luxurious Fifth Ave. building where Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller and his new wife will live, it was announced today.

A spokesman for the Douglas L. Elliman realty firm said the apartment was listed at \$135,000 price, but the selling price might have been more or less.

Nixon will pay \$10,000 a year as his share of maintenance in the cooperative at 810 Fifth Ave. The fifth floor Nixon apartment

has 12 rooms and five baths, including four maid's rooms. It is seven floors below the apartment which has long been owned by Rockefeller and which will be occupied by him and the former Mrs. Margaretta Murphy on return from their honeymoon.

The realty spokesman said Nixon decided to buy the apartment last Saturday just before returning to California. Nixon looked at a half dozen apartments, some of them rental apartments, before deciding on the cooperative which occupies an entire floor. Nixon will join the New York law firm of Mudge, Stern, Blad-

win and Todd June 1 and will give up his residence in California. He will receive title to the apartment May 15 and is expected to move in at the end of the month.

## Chicago Paper Wins Pulitzer Service Prize

NEW YORK (UPI) —The Chicago Daily News Monday was awarded the 1963 Pulitzer Prize for public service "for calling public attention to the issue of providing birth control services in the public health programs of its area."

The gold medal and citation for "disinterested and meritorious public service rendered by a United States newspaper," was voted to the Daily News by the trustees of Columbia University on the recommendation of the advisory board on Pulitzer prizes.

The New York World-Telegram & Sun received the prize for local reporting under edition deadline pressure for its coverage of the American Airlines crash at New York International Airport March 1, 1962.

In the category of local reporting, not under pressure of edition time, the award went to Oscar O'Neal Griffin Jr., 30, who is editor of the Pecos (Tex.) Independent and Enterprise published the first articles that led to the exposure of the Billy Sol Estes scandals.

Anthony Lewis of the New York Times won his second Pulitzer Prize in Journalism for his coverage of the Supreme Court during 1962.

Hal Hendrix of the Miami (Fla.) News was awarded the prize for international reporting for stories concerning the Russian build-up in Cuba during 1962.

The prize for distinguished editorial writing went to Ira B. Harkkey Jr., 45, editor and publisher of the Pascagoula, Miss., Chronicle.

BERLIN (UPI) — The U. S. Army announced Monday that an armored division captain who drove into East Germany Saturday in an Army Jeep has not returned.

A sergeant has been missing from West Berlin since Friday, the Army said.

The reports followed an announcement by the East German news agency ADN that an American Army captain and sergeant had defected. The agency said the two men had requested asylum in the East.

The U. S. Army Headquarters in Europe identified the missing officer as Capt. Alfred Svenson, Seranton, Pa.

An Army spokesman in Berlin said Sgt. Benjamin I. Cain of the 6th Infantry Regiment in West Berlin has been listed as missing since Friday. He gave Cain's home address as Frederica, Del.

ADN said Svenson surrendered to East German border police in the region of Eisenach Saturday. The agency said the officer was in full uniform.

The Communist agency said Cain gave himself up to Eastern border police Friday.

SANTIAGO, Chile (UPI) —Four persons, including two infants and the doctors operating on them, were killed Monday in the explosion of an oxygen tank at Children's hospital here.

At least four doctors and eight nurses were gravely injured in the blast, from unknown causes. A fire which followed the explosion was brought quickly under control.

The blaze was confined to the operating room by quick action of firemen.

## Senate Approves Plan For Payment For Damage Claims

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Senate negotiators gave in Monday and accepted a House plan for paying Philippine war damage claims to individual claimants but barring fees to lobbyists who pushed the bill.

They agreed to a compromise retaining the basic form of the 1952 claims law and scraps a Senate-approved rider to pay the \$73 million maximum involved directly to the Philippine government.

The measure, however, bars any payment in a claims case to any "corporation, association, firm or other individual or party whatsoever."

No claimant could receive his money until he certified that he was not paying anything to any agent.

The provision was written into a \$1.5 billion catch-all supplemental money bill. The Senate-House conferees also agreed on all other differences. Rep. Albert Thomas, D-Tex., chief house conferee, said he hoped to bring the bill before the House later today.

The Senate had voted overwhelmingly to pay the claims money directly to the Philippine government after disclosures that Washington lobbyists, including attorney John A. O'Donnell, stood to reap huge fees from the present law.

The Senate Foreign Relations Committee also disclosed that O'Donnell made campaign contributions to more than 20 members of Congress in 1960 while lobbying for the present act.
