BORN THIRTY YEARS TOO SOON

Two Plan Cross-Country Trip In Special Kayak

PORTLAND (UPI)—Two young Norwegians launched their kayak in the wind-swept Columbia River in a rainstorm Monday and started an eight-month cross-country trip that is scheduled to end eventually in New Orleans.

Bjorn Braaten, 22, and Kare Andersen, 23, both of Oslo, expect to paddle up the Columbia to Pasco, Wash., some 250 miles to the east. From there the kayak will be transported overland to Great Falls, Mont., for the second part of the journey down the Missouri and Mississippi Rivers.

Braaten and Andersen arrived in the United States March 9. Their specially-built kayak underwent tests on the Willamette River here for more than a week before the pair set out. They expect to reach Pasco in about a month.

Best Chance Against Odds

Once in a while when you have a choice of plays you have a definite right way and wrong way.

Other times you have a good play and a poor play. It is rare indeed that all you have is a guess. South ruffs the third diamond in dummy and leads the king of spades. Then he plays a second spade. East follows and South is at the crossroads. Should he finesse the jack or should he try to drop the queen?

As a matter of strict mathematics the drop offers the better chance of success, but there is more to this hand than strict mathematics.

South should finesse because if he finesesses he will make the hand whether or not the finesse works. Actually it does work whereupon South pulls the last trump and eventually tries the heart finesse to see if he can make an over-trick. That finesse will lose, but his contract will be safe.

Suppose the finesse fails to work. West will win a trick with the queen of trumps, but he will have to give the trick back on his next lead.

If he leads his fourth diamond South will trump in dummy and discard his jack of hearts. If a heart is led South will make his jack. If West leads a club South will win with the jack; cash the ace of clubs; enter dummy with its last spade and discard the jack of hearts on the king of clubs.

A—Bid four spades. You expect a diamond lead which will make your king of diamonds a sure trick.

TODAY'S QUESTION

This time your one spade was followed by two diamonds by West; two spades by North and three hearts by East. What do you do?

State Bill Would Permit Exporting Of Raw Logs

SALEM (UPI)—A bill to permit export of certain raw logs cut from state or county lands went to the governor Monday.

The House agreed to accept Senate amendments.

The bill would amend a 1961 law requiring primary manufacture of such logs in Oregon. It would give an outright exemption to Port Orford white cedar. Backers said there is no demand for manufacture of raw cedar logs at Oregon mills.

The measure provides for an export permit system, under the forestry department, for other logs. Export of raw logs would be permitted only when a surplus over the needs of Oregon mills was shown.

ALCATRAZ QUESTIONS

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The House Monday voted to set up a five-man commission to consider such questions as whether a plaque should be affixed to a cell at Alcatraz reading "Al Capone slept here."

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Build A Barbecue For Fun In Your Outdoor Living Rm.

Although charcoal cooking has been employed since man first rubbed two sticks together, it has enjoyed unprecedented popularity in recent years with the fast rise in backyard barbecues.

The present popularity of outdoor cooking originated in California, which generally is conceded to be the source of the simple but mouth-watering dinner of charcoal broiled steak, garlic or cheese sourdough bread, and a mixed greens salad topped with bleu cheese or oil-and-vinegar dressing.

Slowly this truly American meal has spread eastward during the past quarter-century until today almost every hamlet has a steakhouse that serves up a reasonable facsimile.

A home barbecue can either be contracted for or it can be built as a home handyman project. It can be plain and simple or big and costly—ranging from a portable tabletop model available in any housewares store to a "bomb shelter" type that weighs several tons and has warming ovens and other types of conveniences for luscious cookery.

Building a barbecue will vary to some extent depending on the size of the desired structure, but the basic construction remains the same.

An outline of the barbecue should be marked out on the ground, and this should be dug 10 or 12 inches deep. Eight to 10 inches of sand or sand-and-gravel mix is tamped well, and this is topped with concrete between four and six inches deep, depending on the size and weight of the barbecue. This will bring the base two or three inches above ground level for which forms are needed.

A level or plumb bob should be used in laying the base and all courses of brick to insure a perfect level.

The second step is the chimney, built with the level or plumb bob to be sure it is perfectly vertical, for no one wants a miniature "Tower of Pisa" confronting them whenever they barbecue. A hole should be left in the firebox side of the chimney to draw smoke from the fire and up the chimney.

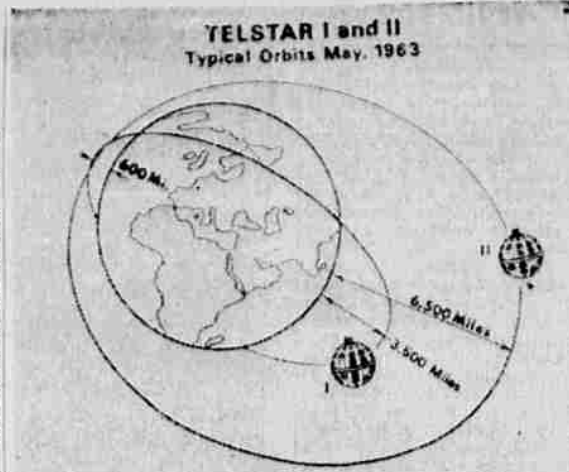
The firebox or ashpit can be constructed of block or brick or rock, or a prefabricated unit can

be bought at a building supply outlet.

Two or three courses of block are laid (again, make sure each course is level) and then sidewalks are built up on the two sides, with an iron grate built into the concrete joint about a foot above the ashpit. Although a bit more difficult to install but much more satisfactory than the built-in permanent grate is a series of two or three steel tracks on which a grate can be inserted at varying levels for different types of cookery.

An excellent accessory for every barbecue is an LP-gas torch that will save 15 or 20 minutes of preparation each time you build a fire. This is the same liquefied petroleum gas familiar to all who live on farms or in country homes, in small towns or other rural areas to provide all the comforts of modern gas appliances far beyond city gas mains.

A small LP-gas hand torch can be used, or a larger refillable tank can be installed for multi-purpose use. The small hand torch will light charcoal in brief minutes.
