Keel recommended that the pool be closed on Mondays and Sunday mornings. He suggested Saturday mornings be left open for swimming meets.

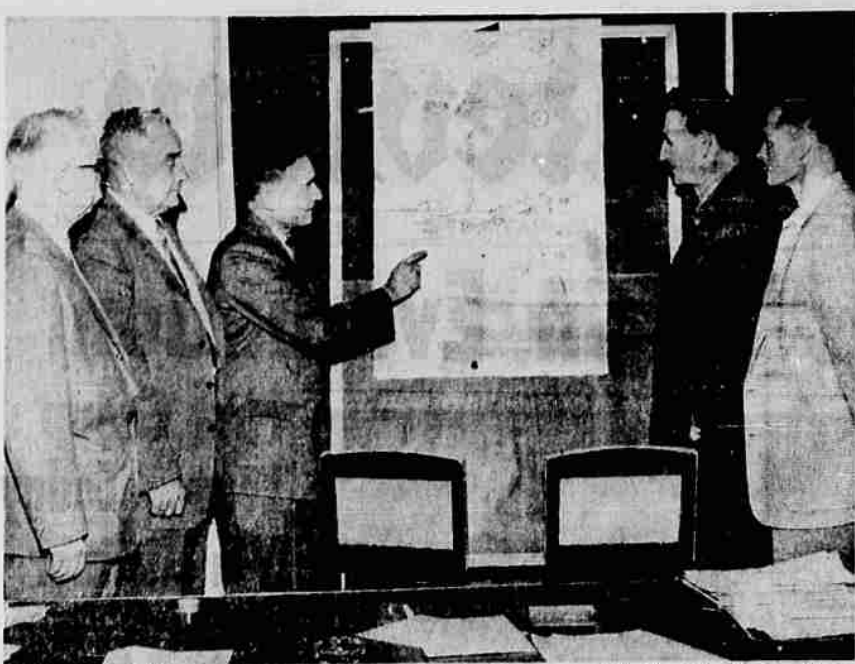
