WASHINGTON (UPI) — A House-Senate conference committee Friday agreed on a compromise \$15.32 billion weapons authorization bill to provide equipment for the armed forces.

The figure is \$35 million less than the total the administration asked, but provides funds for some items which the Pentagon did not request, including \$30.7 million for the controversial R870 warplane, which the Defense Department is not expected to spend.
