

# Vikings Garner Subdistrict Title

The Myrtle Creek Vikings won their fourth straight Subdistrict 6-A-2 championship Saturday by topping the second place Sutherland Bulldogs 142-120 in the sub-district meet held at Myrtle Creek.

Douglas' Trojans came in third with 83 points followed by Glendale Wildcats and the Glendale Pirates tied for fourth with 48 each and the Riddle Irish in sixth with 10.

Individually, the top three finishers in each event will take part in the district meet at Myrtle Creek this Saturday, strongest competition from the southern subdistrict is expected to be from Rogue River. St. Mary's and Myrtle Creek rank as the top contenders dark horses.

The Vikings picked up seven first places in the subdistrict meet Saturday with Sutherland coming in second in that department with four. Douglas picked up two firsts and the final top spot went to Glendale.

# Camas Valley Grabs 4-B Track Honors

Camas Valley's strong track team waltzed away from the field Saturday and qualified nine individuals and a relay team for the state B track tournament in Bend next week.

The real race in the district 4-B tourney was for second place during the meet in Roseburg. Powers finally won that spot, but it wasn't until it had captured the final event of the day, the 800-yard relay. The relay victory pushed Powers into second place by two points over Canyonville Bible Academy. Powers had 77; CBA 75. Other teams and their points were: Canyonville 56 (with five qualifiers for

the state), Oakland 48 (three qualifiers), Elkton 45 (two qualifiers), Yoncalla 17 (one qualifier), Days Creek (no qualifiers). Canyonville Bible Academy qualified only one relay team from Powers and Camas Valley qualified.

**Klab Shines**

Powers could thank its crack runner and jumper, Merle Kalb, for its showing. He accounted for 32 1/2 of his team's points with three personal victories and his anchor job on the relay squad. His team was trailing Camas Valley when he took the final baton. He was the day's high point man.

It was Oakland's Bill Fredericks, however, who broke the only District 4-B meet record. He scaled

the high jump bar at 6 feet 1 1/2 inches. This bested the meet record set over a decade ago by another Oaklander, Dale Roberson.

Another interesting facet of the meet was the pole vault where three men topped 11 feet. Leh Olsen of Canyonville won the event with an 11-6. But close behind were Gary Brooks of Elkton with 11-3 and Mike Heath, a sophomore from Canyonville, with 11 feet exactly.

**Morfin Fast**

Miler Dave Morfin was Cba's only qualifier and he made the grade by breaking his school's record in the event for the seventh time this year. He romped over the four laps in 4:44.6.

Those going to the Bend meet are the first and second place winners in each race. The third place finishers will serve as alternates.

EUGENE, Ore. (UPI) — Oregon's powerful cinder team mauled old rival Washington 103-42 Saturday in the rain here.

But the Huskies accounted for half of the six meet records which fell.

Washington's Brian Sternberg won the pole vault at 15 feet 6 inches; Warhoko West took the triple jump with a 46 feet 2 inch mark and Bill Shinnick hit 25 feet 2 in the broad jump as favored Mel Renfro of Oregon scratched on all four preliminary jumps and never reached the final.

## Roseburg Harriers Fall In Triangular Track Go

The Marshfield Pirates and North Bend Bulldogs broke even in the point column at the triangular meet in Roseburg Saturday to share the championship.

Each had 58 points. Hosting Roseburg had some top, individual performances but had to settle for 35 points.

Roseburg's finest performance came from Tom Dodge who broke the school record with a pole vault of 12 feet 6 inches. The former record was 12-5 3/8.

Dodge had to share his top jump, however, with a Marshfield sophomore, Dennis Parrish, who also cleared the height.

Coach Jack Burg also had high praise for Al Joelsen, Mike Crumican and Doug DuFresne. Joelsen, who has won an every meet, added another victory with a 5-foot 10 high jump. Crumican was again unbeatable in the mile, and DuFresne, who has shown the most spectacular improvement of anyone on the squad, added almost another foot to his shot putting this week.

The Indians were plagued by bad luck which cost points. Crack quartermiler Barry Grant was disqualified because he misjudged the closeness of Bob Shibley of North Bend. In cutting in, he made Shibley break stride. Grant was ahead at the time.

The relay team also lost any chance of winning when it made a bad pass of the baton.

In the junior varsity events which were used as fill-ins during

the meet, four Roseburg winners were listed. They were Steve Vanterling with a 556 in the 440; Larry Helbling with a 39-foot-7 1/2 inch shot put, Charles Harris ran a 23.5 low hurdles and John Shelton had a 114-foot-10 1/2 discus throw.

The next action for the harriers will be the district 5-A-1 qualifying meet in Springfield next Saturday. Winners will go to the state meet in Corvallis the following weekend.
