

Myrtle Creek Rates As Top Local Crew In Track Finale

Myrtle Creek's Vikings will head a strong contingent of local A-2 stars set to compete Friday and Saturday in the state A-2 track meet at Corvallis.

The finals in the pole vault and high jump for the A-2 spikers will be held Friday at 2 p.m., with the preliminaries in the other events to be held from 2 to 5:40. Saturday's finals will begin at noon at the Oregon State track.

In missing the district championship by one point, the Vikings qualified three boys in five events for the state meet.

Ross Barkhurst's blazing 9.85 performance in the 100-yard dash set a new district 6-A-2 standard and ranks him as the best sprinter in the state in his class. The state A-2 100-yard dash record is 10 seconds flat by Bill Ramey of Willamina in 1961. Barkhurst doubled up at the district meet with a discus toss of 145.73.

Ed Cadman will also see action in two events — the mile and 880-yard runs. Cadman finished second in both events with clockings of 4:32 and 2:02.1 respectively.

Ron Salmon's 6-0 high jump set a new district record and ranks him as one of the better high jumpers in A-2 competition.

Sutherland, Glendale and Douglas each qualified one boy for the state meet. Sutherland will send Don Goertzen in the pole vault. Goertzen has a best this year of 12-8 and finished second in the district meet with a 12-3.

Glendale will be represented by Darrell Worley, district 440 champion. Worley won the district race with a 51.2 clocking. Jim Heard will be in action for Douglas after finishing second in the district competition last week with a throw of 139-10 1/2.

Rogue River and St. Mary's will also field strong teams from District 6-A-2, with the champion Chieftains sending three boys to compete in seven events and St. Mary's has four in five events and a relay team.

Don Salyer, Rogue River's triple threat, will see action in the high and low hurdles and the pole vault, while Eagle Point's Sam Charter is among the favorites in the low hurdles.

Tribe Aces Ready For State Meet

Records are made to be broken, by Benson's Sam Whitney in 1954 is almost sure to fall. In this event Gary VanKoten of Grants Pass is setting the pace with a leap of 14-1 1/2, while the other six vaulters in the state have cleared 13-4 or better.

Roseburg qualified three entrants for the state A-1 track meet as a result of last week's district 5-A-1 outing.

Leading the Indians into action will be junior middle distance ace, Mike Crunican. Crunican won the mile with a 4:25.6 clocking at the district meet and holds the school record with a blazing 4:24.4 ran earlier in the season.

Crunican just missed being a double victor in the district action as he covered the 880-yard run in 1:57.3 for a new school record, trailing North Eugene's Mike Curtis at the finish line by one tenth of a second.

Crunican's times rank him sixth in the 880 and the mile among the top prep marks in the state this year.

Pole vaulter Tom Dodge bested his own school record by 10 inches in the district meet when he cleared the bar at 13-4. However, the best he could do was a tie for third as Cottage Grove's Mark Henningsgaard and Chuck Olds went 14-0 1/2 and 13-8 1/2 respectively. Nine vaulters qualified for the state meet from District 5-A-1 by clearing the standard of 12-4 set by the OSAA. However, only eight are eligible as three were from Cottage Grove and the rules allow only two from one school in a single event.

Completing the roster for the Indians will be Barry Grant in the 440. Grant finished second in the district meet with a 51.2 clocking to better his own school record in this event.

North Eugene's Highlanders and Cottage Grove's Lions appear to pack the power from 5-A-1 in the state meet. The Highlanders qualified 10 individuals for 11 events and their 880 relay team. The discus and javelin competition will be the only events that North Eugene is not entered in when the finale starts. Cottage Grove is strong in the field events.

Records in danger at the state meet include the 100-yard dash with Pendleton's Bob Thorne having a 9.7 to his credit, the 220 where Leon Lincoln of Jefferson has a 21.7, the shot where Allen Richards of 58-2, the discus with Richards having a heave of 165-6 1/2, the javelin where Klamath Falls' Walt Smith has a throw of 229-1 1/2, and the pole vault.

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Pro Stars Bolster Alums Roster For Annual Grid Clash Saturday

OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY, Corvallis (Special) — Terry Baker's passes are sure to be one of the highlights of the alumni-varsity football game here Saturday, but causing the varsity equal concern will be a pair of hard-running fullbacks from pro football, Amos Marsh and Nub Beamer.

Each should be in near-top physical condition, following a special training camp. Marsh, in his second year of pro ball with the Dallas Cowboys, emerged as fifth leading rushing yardage man in the National Football League, averaging better than five yards per carry.

Beamer has been with the Vancouver BC Lions in the Western old speed.

Marsh developed more in the pro ranks than he did in college, where he was a fine sprinter on the OSU track team and wingback in single-wing football. Amos still holds the school record for the 100-yard dash at 9.5, and has a 21.0 to his credit in the 220. He's up to 220 pounds in the pro ranks, and apparently hasn't lost any of his



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
