

Red Cross Asks Rummage Sale Support

The Douglas County chapter of the American Red Cross is making a plea to the people of the county to support a rummage and baked food sale sponsored by Roseburg Emblem Club.

The sale will be held Friday from 5 to 9:30 p.m., and Saturday from 7 a.m. until noon. All proceeds will go to the local Red Cross chapter for the blood program.

Mrs. Robert Franks, chairman of the Blood Recruitment Program for the county, said the blood program costs the local chapter \$1,400 a year to maintain. If the county didn't have the program, it would cost residents more than \$30 per pint for blood, she said. The derivative program also saves many dollars, Mrs. Franks pointed out.

4 Visits Per Year
The Bloodmobile visits Douglas County four times a year. The next visit in Roseburg is scheduled June 17 and 18.

Mrs. Franks stated that most people do not realize that the American Red Cross does not own the blood donated by the public; rather, the Blood Program only makes this blood available to hospitals. She emphasized that the five hospitals in Douglas County use more blood and blood derivatives than is collected in the county.

Another point made by Mrs. Franks was made in reply to the question: "Why is it, when it is well known that the blood is donated by the donors, that a price is charged when it is transfused to a patient in a hospital?"

Her reply was that there is never any charge for Red Cross blood itself. A portion of the processing charge of certain items, however, is passed on to the hospital, which in turn may pass it on to the recipient. This is called a hospital participation charge. In certain cases, there is no charge at all.

Costs Explained
She explained that the Red Cross receives \$4.50 per unit to cover the portion of the cost of collection, blood. The remainder of money required to operate the blood program is provided by the local Red Cross chapter.

It is hoped, Mrs. Franks said, that the rummage and baked food sale to be held Friday and Saturday will help raise the \$1,400 needed by the local chapter.

Rummage or other items may be brought to the Elks Temple before 5 p.m. Friday or on Saturday morning. Pick-up may be arranged for by calling the Red Cross office, OR 3-3255.

Presentation of awards to outstanding band students was a highlight of the occasion.

Patty Beardsley was recipient of three awards, as the outstanding band member. She received the Rushton-Reynolds music award, a full scholarship to the Gunnison Band camp at Gunnison, Colo., presented by Verne Reynolds, and also the 1963 Gary Wilson plaque for outstanding performance.

The outstanding junior award went to David Gosline, a \$200 scholarship to a school of his choice after graduation, given by Ricketts Music Store. Charles Ricketts who made the award, announced that Miss Beardsley, who won the Ricketts award last year in a lesser amount, will receive the \$200 scholarship in its place.

Convicted Burglar Appeals To Oregon's Highest Court

John Addison North, 28, Medford, convicted here recently of burglary not in a dwelling in the nighttime with the use of explosives, has filed an appeal from Circuit Court to the Oregon Supreme Court.

North, and Gordon Burton Hibbard, 29, Roseburg, currently are serving 10 years in the Oregon State Penitentiary for an attempted burglary of the Oakland Branch of the Douglas County State Bank Sept. 29, 1962. He and Hibbard were caught in the basement of the bank by Oakland and state police officers.

North contends in an affidavit that he was not involved in the burglary and that the most he could be accused of was trespass, as bank officials and law officers

knew what was going on and could have plugged up the opening into the basement.

At the trial, both North and Hibbard claimed they were in the basement to obtain burglary tools left there by another man who was arrested prior to completing the job.

North stated he has two additional witnesses to help establish his innocence of burglary, and that considering the hours of his work in Medford he could not possibly have been engaged in the burglary prior to the night he was caught in the building with Hibbard.

At his request, Daniel Dimick was appointed by the court to represent him. He has asked for a complete copy of the court trial manuscript and a pre-sentence report on him to assist in his appeal.
