Sex Offender Bill Passes Senate 25-3

SALEM (UPI)—The civil commitment law — key bill in the package of new sex offender measures—was approved 25-3 by the Senate this week and sent to the governor.
The measure provides for a civil complaint against persons believed to be sexually dangerous to children under 12 years of age, and allows confinement for specialized mental treatment.

In other action, the Senate approved and sent to the House a measure increasing District Court judge salaries from \$10,500 to \$11,000.
House measures approved by the Senate were bills which:
—Prohibit unfair practices against farmers who gather together to bargain in selling crops.
—Overhaul local budgeting procedures.
—Create a metropolitan study commission which is mandatory for Portland and permissive in areas such as Eugene and Salem to seek solutions to suburb problems.

Udall says Pesticides Threat To Man, Nature
WASHINGTON (UPI)—Interior Secretary Stewart L. Udall told Congress recently that pesticides are threatening both nature and man.

Udall asked a Senate subcommittee for more research funds to investigate their harmful effects. Organic pesticides such as DDT kill many kinds of living matter beyond what they are designed to do, he said.
