Bank Debits Continue Increase During April

Bank debits for West Central Oregon including Coos, Douglas and Lane counties, increased in April. University of Oregon Bureau of \$244,836,391. For March, 1963, the total was \$228,756,622, and for April, 1962, the total was \$214,475,345.

Oregon, with 255 banks reporting had an increase in bank debits in April, 1963 of plus 8.9 as compared with March, 1963, and an increase of plus 10.0 as compared with April, 1962.

Total debits for Oregon in April, 1963, came to \$2,381,045,248. For March, 1963, the total was \$2,186,397,496 and for April, 1962, the total was \$2,163,995,310.

New Construction Moving Ahead Within Roseburg

Major construction is moving ahead rapidly in Roseburg with two jobs nearing completion and a couple others not far behind.

Blacktopping of the parking area for the new Holiday Motel at SE Oak Ave. and SE Spruce St. was completed Thursday. The main structure is built and only finishing work remains. The project is being rushed to completion. The motel consists of 40 units, plus an office and manager's quarters, with total cost running near the \$150,000 figure, based on building permits, exclusive of grounds, furnishings and fixtures.

Jack West's Apartment House, located on NE Winchester St. also is nearing completion. West said the contractor estimates completion in about two weeks, and applications are now being taken for occupants. The place may be inspected by interested persons now, he said.

Electrical lighting and other installations are now being made. The grounds are to be blacktopped in about a week and other finishing work is going ahead. Some work, such as patios and landscaping will continue after the building proper is finished and is being occupied, said West. Permit was for \$100,000.

Wilson's Chapel of the Roses will not be too far behind A mid-or late-June completion is now contemplated for the \$70,000 project. The grounds are still untouched. The mortuary business will be moved, on completion, from its present location at SE Oak and SE Kane to the W. Harvard Ave. site.

Lockwood Motors now is planning occupancy of its new building on SE Pine between Oak and Washington avenues the latter part of July. The superstructure is completed, but considerable interior work remains on the \$160,000 job.

Building construction is now in evidence for the new Safeway Store and the Pay Less Drug Store, a million-dollar project of Roseburg Plaza. Tilt-up walls for the Safeway building, which is occupying the former Central Junior High property, are being readied this week to set in place, as most of the foundation work is finished.

The foundation for the new Pay Less store at SE Jackson and Washington was being poured. A south foundation wall has already been put in place. This job and that of Safeway was delayed by a slow start, other delays necessitated by weather, and the large amount of excavation necessary in connection with the projects.

Other major local work includes the near \$100,000 remodeling of the Douglas County State Bank, and the \$137,775 (permit value) of the Federal Building (the old post office).

A new ice cream establishment is being erected on W. Harvard Ave., just west of the Oak Street Bridge. Foundation was laid this week. The permit is for \$15,000, issued to Arctic Circle Inc.
