Exotic Salad For Wedding Buffet

In addition to a bride and bridegroom, a wedding traditionally requires something old, something new, something borrowed, and something blue. The "something new" for this year's wedding is likely to be an exotic chicken salad on the buffet. The new version of this old wedding-reception favorite is completely different from the chicken salad of yesteryear; the streamlined model is especially delectable, handsome — and as elegant as the silver in which it will be served.

Wedding Bells Chicken Salad combines the bird with golden pineapple tidbits. To make the dish look especially festive, top it with a dollop of mayonnaise and a cluster of silver almonds. The salad is superb, simple to make, and will meet with such success that the bride herself will want to include it in her cooking repertoire for post-honeymoon entertaining.

As every bride learns, a broiler-fryer is the homemaker's best friend. According to the National Broiler Council, chicken is high in quality protein and pleasantly low in price. And for the young homemaker who keeps a careful eye on her weight, chicken is a natural

for diets because of its low calorie content.

This salad will be so delectable that the "something blue" at the momentous occasion won't be the hungry wedding guest.

Wedding Bells Chicken Salad
To cook broiler-fryer chicken:
1 3-pound broiler-fryer chicken, whole or cut in serving pieces
4 cups water
2 small onions, sliced
4 celery tops
2 bay leaves
2 teaspoons sodium glucomate
2 teaspoons salt

Wash and dry chicken. Put chicken in kettle with a tight fitting lid. Add water and remaining ingredients; cover. Bring to a boil; reduce heat and simmer 40 minutes. Remove from heat; pour broth through strainer. Remove meat from bones in as large pieces as possible. Refrigerate meat and broth at once.

Yield: Approximately 7 cups diced cooked chicken.

To Make Salad:
1½ cups mayonnaise
¼ cup lemon juice
2 tablespoons soy sauce
7 cups diced cooked chicken
1 can (20½-ounce) pineapple tidbits, drained
1½ cups diced celery
1 cup toasted slivered almonds
Combine mayonnaise, lemon juice and soy sauce. Combine with chicken, pineapple, celery and almonds. Toss lightly. Chill. To serve, pile on salad greens in salad bowl. Garnish with additional mayonnaise and sprinkle with additional toasted slivered almonds.

Yield: 16 servings.
