Artists Invited To Participate In Contest To Pick Truck Decal

A contest to secure an original drawing for use as a pattern for a decal to designate membership in the Douglas County Log Truckers Association was announced today by the association.

First prize for the best entry will be \$25. A second prize of \$15 will also be awarded. The contest begins June 1 and will continue until June 30. Entries cannot be postmarked later than midnight June 30.

Rules of the contest are as follows:

1. Entries must be submitted on a regular size sheet of paper, no larger than 8 1/2-by-11 inches.
 2. It must contain or convey the initials or name of the association.
 3. Name, address, age and telephone number of artist should be on back of entry.
 4. All contestants must reside in Douglas County.
 5. Age limits are 6 to 18 years.
 6. No more than three entries may be entered by a single contestant.
 7. In case of duplication, the entry with the earliest postmark will be considered.
 8. Judging is scheduled July 9. Winners will be notified by mail not later than July 12.
- The decal selected will be displayed on trucks and cars of truckers and associate members such as merchants and loggers.

Age Of The Genius Is Past, Olmer Tells RHS Graduates

With the charge of a burgeoning new age ringing in their ears, 266 Roseburg High School seniors were graduated in an impressive ceremony Monday night.

Featured speaker, J. A. Olmer, director of community relations for the Aerospace Division of the Boeing Co. in Seattle, told the graduates the "age of the genius is past."

He said it is a new age of technology, new systems, new methods of research and rapidly expanding knowledge which demands a team approach. The new method of accomplishing goals, he said, is the assignment of a team of specialists to a specific problem because of the great complexity involved.

This means, he said, that attitudes in approaching this bright, new world are all-important.

One of the complexities involved in modern-day problems is the great need for accuracy in machines which are becoming instruments in this new world. He pointed out that some work at Boeing involves accuracies of a millionth of an inch.

Another of the reasons for the need of great specialization with the team approach is the massive acceleration of knowledge. He pointed out that it took 112 years from the time photography became possible chemically until it became a practiced art. In comparison, he said, the transistor, invented six years ago, now appears to be on its way to obsolescence because of new, more satisfactory methods.

Valedictorian of the class was Paul Pilger. Giving the salutatory was Kirsty Williams.

The diplomas were given the graduates by Dr. Nels Lindell, chairman of the Roseburg School Board.

Several Cardinals Named As Likely Pope's Successors

VATICAN CITY (UPI) — A small group of cardinals — five Italians and one Armenian — have been consistently mentioned as possible successors to ailing Pope John XXIII.

The question of succession has been asked, as with every Pope, almost from the time Pope John himself was elected in 1958 at the age of 76.

Now, with the Pope lying seriously ill in the Vatican, it is being asked with new urgency all over the world.

The answer lies beyond the knowledge of any person, including Pope John himself. The papacy does not carry with it the right to choose one's own successor.

The choice could fall to one of those considered leading contenders or to someone whose name has not even come up. There is no way to foretell what the College of Cardinals will do when it meets in secret conclave to elect a new Pope.

Probably the best example of the unpredictability of papal succession is Pope John himself. Almost no one had placed him among the "favorites" when the cardinals met in 1958 to choose the successor to Pope Pius XII.

The name mentioned most often in speculation now is that of Giovanni Battista Cardinal Montini, the 65-year-old "liberal" archbishop of Milan.

Others are:

- Peter Gregory Cardinal Agagianian, 67, the Armenian-born head of Catholic missionary activities.
- Giacomo Cardinal Lercaro, 71, Communist-battling archbishop of Bologna.
- Ernesto Cardinal Ruffini, 75, archbishop of Palermo.
- Valerio Cardinal Valeri, 79, prefect of the Sacred Congregation of the Religious.

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Outdoor Film Producer Killed In Boating Accident

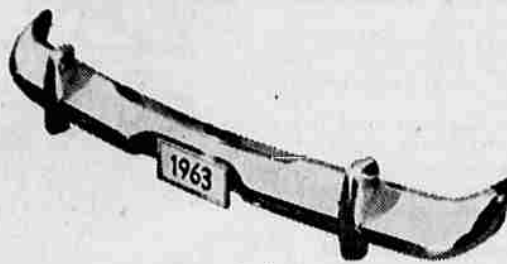
HALFWAY, Ore. (UPI) — An outdoor film producer and his brother, both from Kamiab, Idaho, safely made their way to shore Monday when their river-

The men swam ashore and then Roby said he and his brother, made their way to Halfway.

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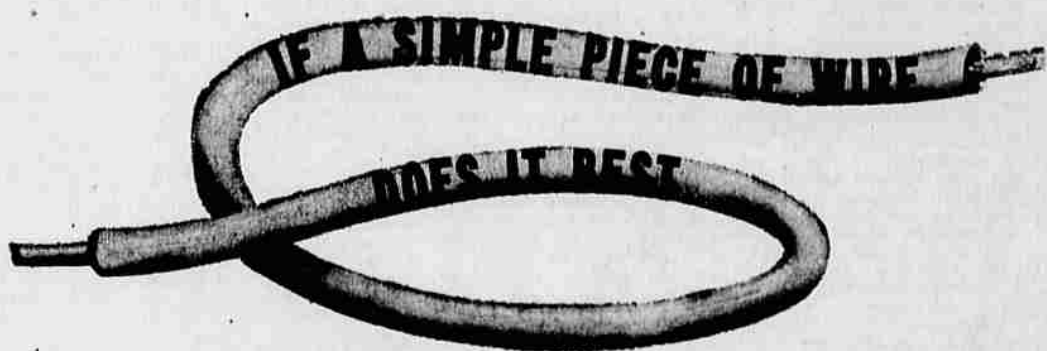
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
