## 2 Roseburg Students Win U.S. Plywood Scholarships

United States Plywood Corp. has awarded two scholarships to graduating seniors at Roseburg High School for the first time as the company undertakes a career-oriented program.

Winners of the scholarships are Milo R. Yount, son of Mrs. Marian Blakely, 190 N.E. Patterson St., and Jerry A. Boucock, son of Mr. and Mrs. Verdun Boucock, 1788 N.W. Olie Lane, according to R. J. Moore, Roseburg Operations Manager.

Both young men will major in engineering at Oregon State University.

The scholarships amount to full tuition and books for each student the first year and, in addition, the company will provide summer employment. After the first school year, summer work will be given with the idea that each student will be able to earn enough money to carry him through the ensuing year.

"For example," Moore said, "one of the boys will be working with the logging department on the engineering crew this summer. The following summer perhaps he will be working in the plywood plant. By the end of his college year, he will at least have been exposed to the major operations here in Roseburg."

Scholarships are available at Oregon State University in engineering or forestry and the University of Oregon in business administration.

The winners were chosen for outstanding scholastic standing, fields of interest and desire, interest in U.S. Plywood as a future employer, appearance and personality and financial need.

Yount had a grade average of 3.665 and was 11th in the class of 290, while Boucock had a grade average of 3.634 and was 14th in his class.

Yount was president of the Honor Society his senior year. Other offices he has held were treasurer of the Hi-Y club in his junior year and president of the group as a sophomore. As a freshman he was a member of the junior varsity wrestling squad.

Boucock played varsity baseball and basketball and was the most inspirational player on the basketball squad by his fellow members. He was also student body president this past year, and as a sophomore was president of that class.

Boucock has also been a member of the National Honor Society and as a junior was representative to Beaver Boys State and assistant sports editor for the school yearbook. He is active in youth work in the Christian church and in his junior year was a representative to the International Christian Endeavor convention in Chicago.

The scholarship reviewing committee was made up of Harry Jacoby, assistant superintendent of the Roseburg school district; Gene Bolen, dean of men, and Moore.

### Study Eyed By Roseburg Youth

Stuart Mitchell Speedie of 735 S. E. Terrace, Roseburg, is one of 58 high school boys from across the nation picked to participate in a Summer Institute for High School mathematics June 24 to Aug. 9 at Oregon State University. He attends Roseburg High School.

The institute is being sponsored by the National Science Foundation to give mathematically-gifted youths an opportunity for special training. Students selected will receive study grants covering part of their expenses.

High school sophomores and juniors from 18 states and the District of Columbia will attend the institute.

Students were chosen for the institute on the basis of their high school scholastic records and recommendations from their teachers and principals.

The seven-week institute will include a "taste of everything" in advanced modern mathematics and its application in science, engineering and industry. It will cover such topics as numerical analysis, linear algebra, electronic computer design and group theory.

This is the fourth year that Oregon State University has been picked by National Science Foundation to offer the special training.
