**Senator Gives Warning
On Right Wing Groups**

PORTLAND (UPI)—Sen. Maurine Neuberger, D-Ore., recently warned the Pacific Northwest regional conference of the AFL-CIO's Committee on Political Education (COPE) of "tax exempt right wing groups."

Mrs. Neuberger told the labor group that "dozens of tax-exempt right wing groups masquerading as education or religious organizations are today flooding the country with extremist partisan political propaganda."

The Oregon Democrat said such organizations were financed by tax-free contributions from businessmen. She listed several organizations she said took in more than \$5.5 million of tax-exempt contributions annually.

Mrs. Neuberger said the tax-free incomes and the shield of respectability "cloak their right wing propaganda."
