# Probers Ask Latin Sugar Quota Data

WASHINGTON (UPI)—A House subcommittee investigating fluctuating sugar prices today called representatives of Brazil, the Dominican Republic, Costa Rica, the French West Indies and the Philippines to testify on their sugar quotas.

One of the representatives, John A. O'Donnell, was a leading figure in the recent dispute over Philippine war claims. He still deals with U.S. sugar quotas for that country, but a subcommittee spokesman said O'Donnell's appearance would have nothing to do with the claims issue.

The representatives were expected to be asked about the ability of the countries they work for to meet this year's sugar quotas which the United States has assigned them.

The subcommittee, headed by Rep. Leonor Sullivan, D-Mo., has been told that sugar prices, which rose to a record level in May will return to normal in the near future.

Other congressional news: Civil Rights —Senate Republicans were pledged to support new civil rights legislation but remained divided on the key issue of ending a filibuster likely to start when such legislation is debated.

Construction —The House approved a 1.6 billion military construction authorization Wednesday over the bitter protests of Rep. Harley O. Staggers, D-W.Va., who said not "one penny" went to his state, the highest unemployment area in the nation.

# Britain Conservative Rule Its Wracked By Scandal

LONDON (UPI)—The resignation of War Minister John Profumo, who admitted he lied about his relations with a red-haired London playgirl, today handed Prime Minister Harold Macmillan the worst political scandal in 11 years of Conservative rule.

It came at a time when Macmillan was preparing for general elections which must be held within the next 16 months, and when his chances already have been harmed by other scandals involving espionage and security leaks.

"What the hell is going on in this country?" asked the nation's largest newspaper, the Daily Mirror. It demanded Macmillan's resignation.

Profumo, handsome 45-year-old millionaire and man about town, admitted Wednesday in a letter to Macmillan that he had lied

# Filibuster Is Key Issue On Civil Rights

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Senate Republicans were pledged today to support "further appropriate" civil rights legislation but were divided as Democrats on the key issue of gagging a filibuster.

GOP liberals, originally hoping for a more sweeping declaration, settled after five hours of closed door debate for a Republican unity statement which avoided all reference to a gag rule.

Democratic supporters of President Kennedy's forthcoming civil rights program — recognizing that Republican votes must be found to kill a talkathon against the legislation—were quick to cite the absence of a GOP closure, or gag rule, pledge.

Sen. Philip A. Hart, D-Mich., one of the liberals backing legislative action on civil rights, told a reporter:

"Closure is the key. Neither side is pure. But I'm glad that a higher percentage of Democrats than Republicans have supported closure. At the beginning of the year, if the Republicans had produced six more votes we could have changed the anti-filibuster rule. I hope both sides have a better record next time."

The present Senate rule requires a two-thirds vote of those present to kill a filibuster.
